Dear Members and Friends of Old Saratoga,

Greetings to you and your families in the Grace and Peace of Christ.

This year's season of **Lent** begins with Ash Wednesday, February 18 and continues for six weeks, culminating in Holy Week (Mar. 29-April 4) and the celebration of Easter (April 5)

Lent is a sacred time for followers of Jesus Christ to contemplate the spiritual mysteries of life and death, and the sacrificial (self-giving) love of Christ that gives our lives meaning and inspires hope for the healing of the world.

As we have done for over thirty-five years, the **ecumenical community** will again come together for services in Lent. All **nine churches** of the Greater Schuylerville Community and/or their pastors will be participating in the **Lenten services**, held each Wednesday evening at 7pm and open to the whole community. (See enclosed schedule!)

This year's **theme** has to do with **sharing the sufferings of Christ**—and living with suffering in a way that does not diminish faith, but gives life and hope. The pastors will be preparing messages that address the following: The nature and reality of suffering; why God allows suffering; the suffering of Christ, the meaning of suffering, sharing the sufferings of Christ, and finding healing through suffering.

Suffering is a **common thread** in our lives and in the life of the world. Almost all families and individuals experience some form of suffering in their lifetimes. Many people have questions about suffering—What causes it? Why does God allow it? Why me or my loved ones? Did I do something to deserve this? Why can't God just take it away? How can I believe in a just and merciful God when there is suffering all around? What do Jesus' sufferings have to do with mine?

These are **honest questions** and help give voice to the complexities surrounding the "problem" of suffering. Our hope in the season of Lent is to help each other see and accept suffering as part of life—and with the Spirit's help, to find meaning in suffering, and discover what it means to share in the suffering of Christ.

The sufferings of our present time are many, but, this has been so from the beginning. Faith insists that it **is** possible to live with suffering, as Christ did, and through it, find ways to affirm love and life that bring **healing** to our hearts, **hope** to the world, and **help** for those who are presently suffering.

God's grace and peace be with us all in Lent.



FATHER JOHN KETTLEWELL RETIRES



On the first Sunday of 2015, Father John Kettlewell, rector of Saint Stephen's Episcopai Church, preached and led his final worship service as rector of the church. He retired at the age of 84. Father John became rector at St. Stephen's just over 24 years ago. Prior to that time, he had served other Episcopal churches in Saratoga and Virginia. In addition to his pastoral work, Father John was a teacher who had a heart for learning disabled youth and those who had difficulty learning in conventional academic settings. For 25 years he taught and served as chaplain at the Blue Ridge School in Virginia, and later in his career here, taught and served as Director of the Adirondack School.

Father John was, and continues to be, an active member of the Greater Schuylerville Ecumenical Association, where he is highly respected and valued for his love of God, his dedication to the church, his theological insights, and for his preaching – especially at the Ecumenical Good Friday Services which he and the St. Stephen's parish hosted for many years.

Father John will continue to live in Schuylerville with his wife, **Susie Cane Kettlewell.** Even though he's 84, and has had to take life a little slower, he still manages to drive up to Moreau Lake State Park almost daily to go for a 3 mile fitness walk.

On Sunday, January 18, the members and friends of St. Stephen's held a lovely dinner in the parish hall in honor of Father John and thanked him for his many years of love and service in the church and community. We continue to be thankful for his presence and pray that God will bless him and his family in his retirement years!

HYMN OF THE MONTH

"Sing to the Lord, you saints of his; praise his holy name." Psalm 30:4

"God Moves in a Mysterious Way"

Most often in our lives, needless to say, we don't understand the way that God works. The transfiguration of Jesus, Moses and Elijah, recorded in Matthew, chapter 17, and Luke, chapter 9, is one of those biblical mysteries that leaves us scratching our heads. We accept on faith the report of Matthew and Luke, and the words of an eyewitness, the disciple Peter, who in his second epistle, chapter 1, states, "... but we were eyewitnesses of his majesty. We ourselves heard this voice that came from heaven when we were with him on that sacred mountain."

This well-known hymn encourages believers to trust in God's ways. It hints at the notion that with God you can expect the unexpected. Take verse 3 of the hymn as an example:

"You fearful saints, fresh courage take; the clouds you so much dread Are big with mercy and shall break in blessings on your head."

The hymn writer is **William Cowper**, an English poet. The poem is sung to a tune found in the Scottish Psalter of 1615. **Erik Routley**, a noted hymnologist, said of this hymn, "This is as near a perfect piece of hymn writing as anybody is likely to come by."

We don't understand God's ways, but his workings as recorded in holy scriptures, and bolstered by our own experiences, tell us that we can trust God's ways. It is exciting to believe that someday in the presence of our Lord we will understand everything, and give God all the glory.

In John, chapter 13, verse 7 we read these words spoken by Jesus to Peter: "You do not realize now what I am doing, but later you will understand."

2014 FINANCIAL UPDATE

Thank you to all of you who supported the ministry of Old Saratoga during 2014. We are truly blessed by the gifts we receive. Our income came very close to our budget projections and exceeded our expectations for missions. Our operating expenses were about what we had anticipated. We used \$800 of our capital improvement funds for the driveway project which was started last year. Because of our budget deficit, we cashed in \$15000 from our investment income, but ended the year with **\$5849.98** after receiving a good response to our Christmas letter of appeal. This money will help us to begin a new year.

As we look forward to another year of serving God both locally and through outreach programs, please continue to pray for and to support our ministry.
