Guest Editorial (written by **Nasa Edgar**, following her trip to the Pringle Home several years ago)

"Would you be interested in the Jamaica Mission Trip to the Pringle Home Orphanage?" asked my pastor. Not knowing what to expect, I said yes. I was asked to be a counselor on the trip. I would be the youngest, at age sixteen, along with two of my church members and six others from another church. In Jamaica, I would have an opportunity to work with children ages five to eighteen. I had been overwhelmed with emotion because I knew this would not be a carefree trip. Furthermore, I could not have known how much this trip would change my life.

Before leaving for Jamaica, there was much to learn about the mission. First, this mission wasn't a leisure trip; we were going there to share God's love with the children. The Pringle Home is one of the Child Sponsorship sites of Global Ministries, and has been caring for boys and girls for over seventy years. It also provides assistance to children who are on the streets, orphaned, and who come from situations of neglect and abuse. Additionally, I learned that some of the kids don't have parents or that their parents can't afford to have them at home. This made me love and appreciate my parents more for taking care of me in the best and most loving way possible. I prepared myself to deal with any situation I might encounter.

My stay at the Pringle Home seemed to pass very quickly because the time I spent with the children was filled with laughter, love and compassion. These moments were very special for me. Of all my memories, I remembered the bond between myself and a nine year old girl. I remember her energy and liveliness. She knew how to make everyone laugh and involve them in any game she contrived. To me she was like a breath of fresh air, because she brought out my inner child. She loved it when I told her stories and listened to her sing. Spending time with the children helped me learn that giving presents was not everything, but that love and attention was what they really wanted. When they received this, they seemed to forget their troubles for a while and enjoyed time with us.

Going on this journey to Jamaica enabled me to take steps in embracing new people, places and cultures. While I taught the children about God's love and worked with them on special activities, they taught me more than they probably could have imagined. From them I learned songs, games, and how to appreciate the things I have at home, such as plumbing and a warm bed all to myself. During our stay, there wasn't any running water for three out of five days at the orphanage. I hardly realized it was an issue because the children's laughter and happiness prevented me and everyone else from worrying about taking long, hot showers. However, behind their laughter, they each suffered from different family problems. One hardly knows this when you look at them. They act like a family to each other and appreciate the caring and loving atmosphere with which Pringle Home provides them.

As I think back, I realize that the most difficult part of the mission was leaving. My eyes filled with tears and I think of the children, especially my nine year old little friend, waving and crying as they ran after our departing bus. Some even yelled, "Don't go," or "Please don't go." This was very emotional for us all. I'll forever remember their faces and merry laughter. The mission trip I took to Jamaica was a defining experience and it has taught me that I can make a difference. I now have a better understanding of lives beyond my own. This will enable me to extend the kindness and care that I discovered, during my summer experience, to others.

"Sing to the Lord, you saints of his; praise his holy name." Psalm 30:4

"Seek Ye First the Kingdom of God"

"Seek ye first the kingdom of God and its righteousness,

Inspired by a sermon on Matthew 6:33, Karen Lafferty composed a tune to accompany this important message. The verse, taken from Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, challenges our thinking in regard to priorities in life. The eternal things of God are to be considered first. Our gracious and merciful God will take care of the rest. As followers of Jesus, we know that the eternal God cares for us completely. Our every need is known to him. God is ever near to lead, to guide, to nurture, and to supply. We must make God's kingdom, and a path of righteousness, our priorities.

Lafferty's melody, composed in 1972, is contemporary in style. The alleluias at the close are offerings of praise to the God who has promised to be our sufficiency. A second verse was attached anonymously and is based on Matthew 7:7. Also part of the Sermon on the Mount, this verse speaks to the boldness with which we are to approach God in prayer; to "ask, and it shall be given...."

This simple but beautiful melody is often repeated several times, or the song can be sung as a round. Singing the song is also a great way to memorize scripture. **Dick Behrens**


