From the Pastor...

The Lord bless and keep thee; the Lord make his face shine upon thee and have mercy on thee; the Lord lift up his face upon thee, and place peace in thee.

Numbers 6:23 (Jubilee Bible 2000)

Dear Members and Friends of Old Saratoga,

Grace to you and the peace of Christ.

It was the afternoon of Sunday, August 30, a week after we had returned home from my father's funeral in Michigan. David, Mikael and I were on the Rhode Island coast where we camped for a week toward the end of summer. I was still feeling the sadness and fatigue of our second trip to Michigan and back, but glad to be near the healing sound, smell and sight of the deep blue ocean sparkling in the sun.

We had driven to Point Judith to have a seafood lunch and visit the famous lighthouse there. We were disappointed to find the lighthouse grounds closed to the public; so we walked up to the nearby overlook where people of all ages were sitting, sunning, flying kites, and reading books. It was a warm day and the ocean breeze felt refreshing. Mikael and I were walking along a ridge in the direction of the lighthouse, when we heard a strange sound—something like a fog horn. We turned around and saw David a ways back talking to a woman holding something in her hand. Mikael and I walked back to where they were. The woman was holding a shofar (a three-foot long ram's horn) and had just sounded it in the direction of the ocean. She said she takes it with her to places like this and plays as the spirit moves her. She then, with great effort, sounded the shofar for us again. The sound was powerful.

I asked her if she blew the shofar in a temple. She answered that she's been involved with some Jewish Christian groups who worship "Jesuah" (Jesus). She reached out her hand to me and said "I'm Mary." I held her hand and said "I'm Joyce and this is Mikael". (David had stepped away by then). She then surprised us by saying, "I want to sing a blessing for you and Mikael." At that point, in a clear, strong, deep voice, she sang in Hebrew the benediction from Numbers 6 (above) and afterwards, spoke it to us in English. "The Lord bless you and keep you...and make his face shine upon you...and give you shalom (peace) from the top of your head to the soles of your feet, and to every cell in between." Those were her exact words. I had tears in my eyes before she finished. "Thank you Mary", I said as I hugged her. "Blessings to you...You have a wonderful voice for singing blessings." "Maybe" she said, I could sound the shofar and be a cantor somewhere." "Maybe!" I answered. Then we said good-bye.

I'm still thinking of that mysterious meeting and what it meant. Mary knew nothing about us or our life, but she somehow felt moved to give us a blessing of God's peace. Mary's simple, beautiful act of love and care, was a vivid reminder to me that God who loves us all, does continually bless us in surprising ways. And why? Could it be for the reason that God said to our ancient father in the faith, Abraham: "I will bless you...so that you will be a blessing."? (Genesis 12:2.)



HYMNS OF OUR FAITH

"Sing to the Lord, you saints of his; praise his holy name." Psalm 30:4

"Give to the winds your fears, in hope be undismayed;

God hears your sighs and counts your tears,
God shall lift up your head;

Through waves and clouds and storms he gently clears the way;

Wait for his time, so shall the night soon end in joyous day."

This hymn, written by the German-born Paul Gephardt in 1653, is a paraphrase of Psalm 37. The psalm begins with the words, "Do not fret because of those who do evil." It goes on to say that "the wicked plot against the righteous." But the psalmist David is not perturbed. He indicates that our response to the threat of evil should be to "Trust in the Lord and do good." Gephardt interprets this advice as "Give to the wind your fears." Let the wind carry your worries away. David is not being flippant in dispensing his advice. Rather, he supports his belief in God's providential care by speaking of his life experience as found is verse 24: "I have never seen the righteous forsaken or their children begging bread." For this writer, that statement is among the most reassuring of any found in Holy Scriptures.

Gephardt lived in a war-torn Europe. He had experienced the loss of four children in their infancy and the death of his wife after just 13 years of marriage. As a pastor, he was the center of political and theological controversy. Yet his words speak of an inner serenity born out of his faith and trust in the promises of God of which David spoke in his psalms. Most hymnals now only show two of the original fourteen verses. Consider the following verse as an appropriate closing statement:

"Far, far above your thought his counsel shall appear,

When fully he the work has wrought that caused your needless fear.

Leave to his sovereign will to choose and to command:

With wonder filled you then shall own how wise, how strong his hand."
