#### From the Pastor

Dear Members and Friends of Old Saratoga,

My family and I are most grateful to you for the loving kindness and support you gave us at the time of my father's death in mid-August. Your prayers, calls, emails, comforting cards and written messages were such a help and consolation. We thank you for your love and care during this sad time of losing our father and grand-father.

We were also grateful for the immediate offers and willingness to help when we learned we would have to make another trip back to Michigan to help plan and be present for my father's funeral and burial. I thank especially Chris Garney who offered to plan and help lead worship on the two Sundays I would be away, to Elder Patrick Woomer, who stepped in to officiate at a wedding I had planned to do, and to the consistory for their understanding and support. Our trip back to Michigan was hastily planned, but I left here with the peace of knowing everything was in good hands.

My father taught me (and my siblings) many things about life, nature, faith and what it means to be thankful. In the eulogy I offered at his memorial service, I shared what a Dutch friend of my father (who would often pick Dad up on Sunday mornings to take him to the Christian Reformed Church in the community where my father's assisted living home was located) told us about Dad just a few days before he died. The friend, whose name is John, said that he had gone to visit Dad and offered to pray with him. Dad, who was having trouble breathing and wearing an oxygen mask, wanted to lead the prayer. John told us later that "your Dad prayed the prayer of a thankful man" as he gave thanks to God for the blessings of his life, his family, his work and his faith.

What John told us about Dad's prayer gave us great comfort and peace in our sadness and helped us realize anew our own gratitude to Dad for all he gave us in his almost 89 years.

Though my heart is still heavy, it's also full of gratitude for my father's love and life, for our family, and-- for you our church family and friends whose love, help and prayers are helping us through this time of loss.

#### **HYMNS OF OUR FAITH**

"Sing to the Lord, you saints of his; praise his holy name." Psalm 30:4

"Let your heart be broken for a world in need Feed the mouths that hunger, soothe the wounds that bleed:

Give the cup of water and the loaf of bread Be the hands of Jesus, serving in his stead."

Bryan Jeffrey Leech, a minister of the Evangelical Covenant Church, is also the author of 250 songs, cantatas, octavos, and hymns numbering thirty-three. Among his most well-known work is the communion hymn "Come Share the Lord."

Leech was born in England in 1931, spending half of his life there before moving to the United States. He received his BA from Barrington College in Rhode Island and attended North Park Seminary in Chicago. Pastorates took him to Boston, Montclair, NJ, San Francisco, Santa Barbara and Oakland.

One of the great men in his denomination suggested that Leech write a text for World Relief Sunday. Leech experienced difficulty this challenge. All he could think of were the many faces of starving children in faminestricken areas of the world which he had seen in the media. He asked himself, "How could one sing about such appalling misery?" Then he remembered the words that Bob Pierce, the founder of Samaritan's Purse International Relief, wrote in his Bible after visiting suffering children on the Korean island of Kojedo: "Let your heart be broken with the things that break the heart of God." With this inspiration the hymn was born. The writer challenges us throughout the hymn, but particularly in the words of the fourth stanza:

"Add to your believing deeds that prove it true Knowing Christ as Savior, make him Master too; Follow in his footsteps, go where he has trod, In the world's great trouble risk yourself for God."
