Sunday, May 22 was Children's Sunday at Old Saratoga. Our boys and girls, with the help of their Sunday School leaders, Chris Garney and Donna Mellen, prepared and led worship.

The children were all wearing colorful tie-dyed "Hippies for Hope" T-shirts they had made with the help of Sunday School parents, Theresa and Tod Tomlinson. ("Hippies for Hope" was one of the Sunday School mission projects.)

One by one, starting with Trevor Lewie who welcomed the people and gave the call to worship, the boys and girls took turns getting up to read, to pray, to tell about the craft and mission projects for the year.
