Greetings in the grace and peace of Christ!

The words above are from an anthem the choir sang on June 1, Children's Sunday! On this day the church celebrates that we are all "wonderfully made" children of God. The young ones in our midst, so full of life, love, trust, dependance, and curiosity, remind us of Jesus' words that "to such belong the Kingdom of God."

It's a true joy to be with children in worship; to see them eagerly taking their parts; reading and leading prayer, sharing what they've learned about God, life and the world. They do inspire us with hope for the future of the church; but they also inspire us with love and joy in the present moment when we celebrate the blessings of God.

After retiring from Schuylerville, he served as a half-time guidance counselor at St. Mary's Church School in Glens Falls; and following that, served as head of the Warren/Washington County Head Start program, both of which he enjoyed.

Dick officially retired in 1987. He and his wife Margaret live on Hayes Road with their dog, Simba. They have two children, a son, Glenn Jacobson, and a daughter, Gayle Emmet, who are both married and live in the area. They have a grandson who is an assistant professor at Fordham University.

Dick enjoyed tennis and skiing, and has been singing in church choirs throughout his life. He currently sings tenor in our church choir. He also has a fascinating collection of old clocks, an interest he attributes to his grandfather.

Dick recently expressed his desire to become a member of Old Saratoga. We welcomed him on Profession of Faith on Sunday, May 18.
