#### From the Pastor...

Dear Members and Friends of Old Saratoga,

Greetings to you and your families in the grace and peace of Christ!

Autumn has come as of Sept. 22 and the signs of a changing season are all around. The leaves of the Burning Bushes at the church are turning red, and at the top of the maples, one can see the golden hues appearing.

Later this month, on Sunday, October 27, we will commemorate the 500<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Reformation, an event in our faith heritage reminding us of the ever-changing nature of life and the ever-present need for reform and renewal, not only in the church, but in all aspects of life.

As we think about the seasons of change and renewal, I want to give you all an update about the Albany Synod Fellowship Program and the anticipated arrival of our ministry fellow, **Jennifer Legg**, a 2011 Master of Divinity graduate of Western Theological Seminary. Jennifer will be moving to our area during the fourth week of October and plans to live in an apartment in Greenwich. She will officially begin her ministry here on November 1.

During the week of her visit to our area (Sept. 13-17), many of us were delighted to meet her and get to know her better. She had opportunity to visit all three churches (Old Saratoga, Bacon Hill and Fort Miller), meet with the pastors, share in church events, and get to know her way around the area.

On September 25, a team of representatives from each congregation, including the pastors, met to finish drawing up a two-year contract with Jennifer. (Elder **Paulette Foote** and Deacon **Anne Mitchell** are Old Saratoga's team members.) Jenn's responsibilities among the three churches will focus on worship leadership, outreach ministry, and pastoral care. The team and Jennifer will meet on a monthly basis to do planning and give direction, feedback and evaluation.

Jennifer will be considered a full time employee of the Synod of Albany. The Synod will pay the bulk of her salary and benefits, with help from the Classis of Schenectady and financial contributions from the three churches.

Jenn had a very favorable impression of the churches and the people here and is excited about coming to work among us. We too are looking forward to her presence and ministry of sharing the Love of God.

We are grateful to the Synod for inviting us to be part of this new program to benefit both new pastors and existing congregations. It opens up for all of us an opportunity for cooperative ministry among the three local Reformed churches, and explore creative, adaptive forms of ministry as the times and seasons of the church change.

Thank you all for your support and prayers for Jennifer and for the churches in the weeks and months ahead!

#### **REFORMATION SUNDAY** Oct. 29

Commemorating the 500th Anniversary

On Sunday, Oct. 29, we will commemorate the 500<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Reformation. The Reformation began in 1517 in Europe as a reform movement within the one Roman Catholic church, but quickly led to division. (On Sunday, Oct. 8,15, 22, 29, **Dick Behrens** will lead a "Reformation Moment" during All God's children to help us learn more about the Reformation!)

We will commemorate this anniversary, but will not "celebrate" it. Though the Reformation gave birth to Protestant denominations such as our own Reformed Church, we hear the call of Christ to all his followers, Catholic and Protestant, to be ONE. Until that day comes, the church must keep reforming until we can come together, celebrate communion at the same table, and be the one Body of Christ.

We give thanks for the progress that's been made over the past 50 years especially here in our small community. We are grateful that Protestants and Catholics worship together as we do during the Lenten Season; and meet together every week for Bible reading and study; that we, Protestants and Catholics, work hand in hand to help address community needs.

It is our hope and prayer that these small, but significant efforts will help bring reform and unity to the church, and that someday we will celebrate the conclusion of the Reformation, when we truly are one community of faith in Christ Jesus.

#### HYMNS OF OUR FAITH

"Sing to the Lord, you saints of God; praise his holy name." (Psalm 30:4) "All Glory Be to God on High" "All alory be to God on High and thanks to him

"All glory be to God on High and thanks to him forever!

Whatever Satan's hosts may try, God foils their dark endeavor.

He bends his ear to every call and offers peace, goodwill to all, And calms the troubled spirit."

"All Glory Be to God on High" can be called a Reformation hymn as it was written in 1522,

5 years after Martin Luther posted his 95 Theses. It praises an attribute of each person of the Trinity: God the Father's perfect will and might, Jesus Christ's work in redemption, and the sprit's life-giving breath.

The writer was Nicolaus Decius, (1456-1541) a monk and disciple of Martin Luther, who studied at Wittenburg and received a Master's, becoming an assistant pastor at St. Nicholaus, on Martin Luther's recommend-dation. He served the church as teacher, pastor and musician, encouraging the congregational singing of hymns.

This hymn predates Luther's "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God" by a year, with interesting similarities: both hymns reference Satan; both speak of dangers God's people face; both speak of God as our defender. These similarities reflect the dangerous times in which the Reformation originated.

This writer is a firm believer in in the need for congregational singing that affirms the written and spoken word, and the individuals who fill the pews as equal participants in worship. We owe a debt of gratitude to men such as Decius and Luther, who regarded worshipers so highly.
