From the Pastor...

"What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overpower it."

John 1:3b-5 NRSV

Dear Members and Friends of Old Saratoga,

Greetings in Advent to you and your families!

Holiday lights are appearing all around the villages and countryside. Our son Mikael exclaims "Look at that!" when we drive by a light display! I must say that I too enjoy seeing the lights in people's homes and yards especially at this time of year when the hours of darkness are longer than at any other time.

It won't be long though, before the hours of daylight begin to increase! Sunday, Dec. 21, both the shortest day and longest night of the year (in the Northern Hemisphere), marks the First Day of Winter. On this day, the winter solstice occurs in the evening at 6:03 EST From that time on, the hours of daylight will "grow"!

From ancient times until the present, the winter solstice has played an important role in many cultures around the world. An example of this is our own Christian celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ. It was organized around the time of the winter solstice when light "returns" to the darkened world. This powerful cycle of nature was used to symbolize the light Christ brings to a world where "people are walking in darkness". (Isaiah 9:2 NIV)

It is our belief that the light manifested by Christ in his love for the world, is the very Light of God the Creator which is life in us and in the world around us. This life, as the gospel writer John expressed "was the light of all people."

In the lovely old German Christmas carol "Silent Night", Jesus is portrayed as "Son of God, love's pure light!" Light here points to the radiance of the all-encompassing Love of God. God's everlasting Love is the light we seek along life's journey. It helps us see what we're truly meant to be. The light of love is what God shares with us and all creation. When we "see the light" in Christ, and connect with the love within, we begin to discover the intended fullness of our humanity!

Just as the solstice represents a turning point in the path of the sun, the coming of Jesus represents a turning point in the life of humanity. The radiance of his love reveals the woeful futility of war, hatred and division to bring peace to the world; whereas, the growing light of his love, compassion and forgiveness shines in the darkness and opens the way to hope for a community of love and peace on earth.

May we all be touched by the Light of God's Love as we celebrate Christ's birth and help in whatever ways we're led to help brighten the world with mercy and Love.



"There's Something About That Name"

The birth of the "promised one" is recorded in the first chapter of the Gospel of Matthew. At verse 21 we read of an angel appearing to Joseph with this message: "She (Mary) will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." This is the name about which contemporary gospel music composers, Bill and Gloria Gaither, wrote in 1970.

The prophet Isaiah had foretold that a child would be born who would be called "Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." The name of Jesus has come to mean many things to many people. Jesus' name is synonymous with love, compassion, healing, comfort, and power. The song writer knows Him as "Master, Savior, (and) like fragrance after the rain."

In Jesus' name, sins are forgiven, and petitions offered. It is a name that has endured through more than 2,000 years of human history, and in which believers find strength.

"Jesus, Jesus, Jesus; there's just something about that name!

Jesus, Jesus, Jesus, let all heaven and earth proclaim;

Kings and kingdoms will all pass away, But there's something about that name!"

NOV. DEACONS FUND OFFERING FOR LOCAL GUARDIAN HOUSE

Thanks to all who helped support our November Deacon's Fund mission, the **Guardian House of Saratoga**. The special offering totaled \$128.

The Guardian House, started in 2008 through a grass-roots effort aided by the Dept. of Veteran's Affairs, is located in Ballston Spa. Currently, 14% of all military personnel are women.

The house is a temporary home for homeless women veterans, who receive food and shelter, counseling for mental health and substance abuse, and job training for employment. The goal is to help them re-enter society and be self-supporting.

The Guardian House, which can serve up to eleven women at a time, is dependent upon local donations and some help from the Veteran's Administration. The home is also in need of household goods-like dish and laundry detergent, paper products (toilet paper, tissues, paper towels, etc.) twin sheet sets, towels of any size and washcloths, and cleaning supplies.

Our Women's Guild has placed a collection box in the church for those who would like to donate any of the above items to the Guardian House over the holiday season. Thanks for your help! Isaiah 58: 6-7
