

HYMN OF THE MONTH

"COME, YE THANKFUL PEOPLE, COME"

"Come, ye thankful people, come; raise the song of harvest home. All is safely gathered in ere the winter storms begin.

God, our maker, does provide for our wants to be supplied;

come to God's own temple, come, raise the song of harvest home."

This song of praise tells of God's hand in creation and speaks to the ongoing processes of planting, harvest and thanksgiving. The singer is invited to give recognition to God, the creator, who makes all these possible.

"The harvest season is a time of mixed emotions. On the one hand, it is a time of grace and bounty, or increase, prosperity, and provision for the year to come-indeed a time to give thanks. On the other hand, it is the season of withering and dying, when nature experiences the onset of winter. In both cases, it is the culmination of a process. The season of growth, from its beginning, has been leading to this moment."

In a sobering manner, the third verse of this hymn speaks to what we have done to produce "spiritual fruit." Just as the tares are separated from the wheat, so God will judge the work that we have done for his kingdom, and the "good fruit" will be separated from that which is not usable.

The fourth stanza is a prayer for God's deliverance, and reveals the hope that we have in eternal life in God's presence. May this be our daily prayer, not only in thought, but also in action.

"Even so, Lord, quickly come to your final harvest home,

gather all your people in, free from sorrow, free from sin, there, forever purified, in your presence to abide.

Come with all your angels, come, raise the glorious harvest home."

GUEST EDITORIAL



John Wilbur Chapman 1859-1918

On Sunday, Oct. 26 (Reformation Sunday) the church celebrated its heritage with a special service commemorating the life and pastorate of **John Wilbur Chapman**, who was a minister at Old Saratoga from 1883-1885. During the service the congregation sang three hymns ("Our Great Savior," "Tis Jesus," and "One Day") which Rev. Chapman authored. The following is an excerpt from a talk that **Dick Behrens**, OSRC church archivist, presented during that service:

"John Wilbur Chapman, pastor, evangelist, supervisor of evangelists, General Secretary of the Presbyterian Church, Moderator of the Presbyterian General Assembly, author, hymn writer – these are among the accomplishments of one who became world renown. His work for God found him serving in churches both small and large, rescue missions, town halls, concert halls and large arenas. His pastorates began in rural Indiana and continued in Schuylerville, Albany, Philadelphia and New York City. In whatever church he served, congregations grew. At First Reformed Church of Albany some 500 members were added in the five years of his service. The Sunday School at Bethany Presbyterian Church in Philadelphia reached a record high enrollment of 6,027 in 1898, making it the world's largest. His work as an evangelist found him preaching on several continents. Chapman held revival meetings in many US cities, including Saratoga Springs, and the Canadian cities of Montreal, Quebec, Toronto and Vancouver. He listened to and worked with the evangelist Dwight L. Moody. Chapman himself hired Billy Sunday to work on his team, launching the career of that great evangelist. He was heavily involved in promotion of religious summer conferences, at one point directing the Winona Bible Conference in Indiana, and helping to establish Bible conferences in Montreat, North Carolina, and Stony Brook, New York. His labors took him to England, Australia, China, Korea and Japan. Through the year 1912, it is estimated that he preached 50,000 sermons to some 60 million people. Decisions for Christ are conservatively estimated to be in the tens of thousands. On Christmas Day, 1919, in Jamaica, Queens, John Wilbur Chapman went to be with the Lord at age 59.

J. Wilbur Chapman's pastorate at Old Saratoga (the Dutch Protestant Church) at Schuylerville was for a period of only two years (188301885.) In that itme one hundred members were added to the church. Although the duration of his ministry in this locale was brief, it was Chapman's first pastoral experience outside the friendly confines of his home state of Indiana. Upon his leaving, the Consistory and membership comforted themselves with the belief that he had work of increased importance ahead of him. They were correct in that belief. Old Saratoga was a blessing for Chapman in the development and growth of his ministry. Old Saratoga was the richer for the time he spent here."
