HYMN OF THE MONTH

"Sing to the Lord, you saint of his; praise his holy name. (Psalm 30: 4)

"Forth In Your Name, O Lord I Go My daily labor to pursue; You, Lord, alone I choose to know In all I think or speak or do."

Charles Wesley's hymn "Forth In Your Name, O Lord, I Go" was originally entitled "For Believers Before Work." Wesley knew quite well that Christians have to be a part of society. The labors that we perform are done in part to please our employers, but, our worship and our daily tasks must both be done as unto the Lord. The hymn reinforces the notion that all believers are missionaries, regardless of their vocation. Austin Lovelace, a noted church musician, has commented, "Most hymns stick to Sunday. Charles Wesley sang about weekdays as well."

At the start of the month of September, Americans celebrate Labor Day. We honor the service and productivity of our fellow countrymen, and as recipients of all that God has provided, give thanks to God for the blessings of labor. As with so many other celebrations, we need to recognize and live in the spirit of these blessings every day of the year.

Two of the other five stanzas of this hymn effectively convey the intent of Wesley's message.

"The task your wisdom has assigned Here let me cheerfully fulfill; In all my work your presence find And prove your good and perfect will.

You would I set at my right hand Whose eyes my inmost secrets view: And Labor on your command And offer all my work to you."

SYMPATHY



From the Pastor...



Dear Members and Friends of Old Saratoga,

Greetings to you and your families in God's grace and peace!

We're in the midst of Autumn—and also in the midst of some very busy months at church—and some very troublesome times in the world. With all that's going on—in and around us—it's easy to "breeze" through autumn without fully savoring its beauty or listening for its lessons.

Autumn is by far my favorite season of the year. Everyday I walk by the lovely lavender asters in full bloom around the church and parsonage yard. The leaves of the maples and yellow poplar are just beginning to turn color. Falling leaves descend as the wind swirls them gently down. Already the grass is partly covered with shades of gold and orange. Pumpkins and cornstalks are everywhere—and fresh apples—which remind me of the apple-picking, cider—making seasons of my childhood growing up in a western-Michigan orchard.

My biggest "fear" during Autumn, is that it will all go by too quickly, and for lack of time, I won't see the subtle changes from day to day, or I'll miss taking that extra walk in the woods, or another drive through the beautiful country back-roads, or just pause for a moment to feel the warmth of the sun when the air is chill.

For me one of the lessons of Autumn—a season like life itself that comes and goes too quickly— is to appreciate the time and the moment of great color and beauty, the preparation for renewal, before we have to bid it all farewell.

One of my favorite poets, May Sarton, writes, " I think of the trees and how simply they let go, let fall the riches of a season, how without grief (it seems), they can let go and go deep into their roots for renewal and sleep..."

"Letting go" as trees do with their leaves, in order that they can "go deep into their roots for renewal..." is another spiritual lesson of Autumn. People, like trees, need to "let go" of things that require a constant drain of energy, and rest in the renewal and peace the Great Creator provides.

I know there are those who don't like the fall so much because it reminds them of winter coming. And winters here can be frightful, long, and isolating. But all the more reason to learn from nature that there is a purpose for rest and renewal during the long winter months —even though it's not always pleasant, convenient or perceptible.

So it is with life—and death—and living day by day through all the changing seasons of our lives. And as those seasons come and go, God is ever whispering to our hearts, "See! I am making all things new!" (Revelation 21:5)
