#### From the Pastor

"You have heard it that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor, and hate your enemy. But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you so that you may be children of your Father in heaven..." Matthew 5:43-45a)

-Jesus, from his Sermon on the Mount

Greetings to you and yours in the grace and peace of Jesus Christ!

When I started writing this page, the funerals had begun for the nine people, including state senator and Pastor Clementa Pinckney, who were killed by a 21-year old man on June 17 at the Emmanuel African United Methodist Church in Charleston, South Carolina. When the shooting occurred, pastors and church members had been meeting for Bible Study and prayer. They had welcomed the young stranger to join them, unaware of his hidden motives.

The shock and anguish which followed shook this faith community to the core—and stunned the nation with a raw reminder that racism is still with us.

Many were asking how Emmanuel U.M.E. church would respond? Many of us were thinking, how we would respond if this happened in our church?

While much of the ensuing media coverage has focused on why the Confederate flag continues to be flown...some attention was given earlier on to what the church had to say to the young supporter of white supremacy who coldly killed nine beloved members of their congregation.

Amazingly, the words they and several families spoke were words of **forgiveness**. At the initial court hearing two days later, this is some of what they said to the killer who appeared by video: "I forgive you, my family forgives you"..." (Anthony Thompson); "I forgive you and have mercy on your soul." (Nadine Collier, who lost her mother); "We are here to combat hate-filled actions with love-filled actions...and that is what we want to get out to the world." (Alana Simmons, who lost her grandfather)

In an online article entitled, "Charleston Is Testing the Soul of America", by Jim Wallis of the Sojourners community, wrote that the church and families of the slain "are telling the country that **love is stronger than hate**."

As the New York Times reported, "This is not to say that the families do not feel moments of rage and heartbreak. Nor should their forgiveness be mistaken for acceptance." (6-25-15) Despite their anguish and pain, they do want justice to be done.

But, as a 37-year old member of the church said, " **We have been taught forgiveness**." She is right. The church has been taught to forgive by the One who forgave all on the cross. And even though we have often failed to live up to that teaching, the words of Jesus are always with us: "Love your enemies, pray for those who persecute you, forgive as you have been forgiven." Impossible as it may seem, Jesus revealed to the world that love and forgiveness alone have the strength to break the power of evil and hatred.

Let us pray for our grieving sisters and brothers in Christ in Charleston, for the families of those who died, for our nation, and for the church of Jesus Christ, that we may be healed of our divisions and live in God's peace.

For you will spread out to the right and to the left... Isaiah 54:2

### RCA GENERAL SYNOD UPDATE

I attended General Synod as an Elder from Schenectady Classis. There were two Elder delegates and two minister delegates. As official delegates we had both "voice" and "vote." The other local delegates were Revs. Janet Vincent and Ann Reilly, and Elder Kitt Jackson. There were 12 delegates from the Albany Synod.

We flew into Chicago and were shuttled to Trinity Christian College where we spent the next five days. I roomed with an experienced delegate who balanced my "newness." At mealtimes we were encouraged to sit with new people and get to know them, which proved to be one of the most valuable and enjoyable parts of the trip.

We met in Plenary sessions three times a day, with the evening session often being a worship time or special presentation, at which no business was conducted. Worship was another part of the experience I enjoyed.

On Friday the President gave his report and recommended that a council be assembled during the coming year to try to find a way forward for the denomination.

### **Synod Recommendations:**

That the RCA exercise a season of restraint, refraining from ordaining or marrying homosexuals, and refraining from bringing charges against those who do, and last, refraining from leaving the denomination.

That a special council be formed to describe a constitutional pathway to address the questions of human sexuality as it relates to ordination and marriage, and to bring recommendations to General Synod 2016.

The new General Synod president is **Evan Vermee**r, previous vice-president, and Elder at 1st Reformed in Sioux Center, Iowa.

#### **HYMNS OF OUR FAITH**

"Sing to the Lord, you saints of his; praise his holy name." Psalm 30:4
"Moment By Moment"

"Moment by moment I'm kept in His love, Moment by moment I've life from above; Looking to Jesus 'til glory doth shine Moment by moment, O Lord I am thine."

The story is told that it was during the Great World's Fair evangelistic campaign, about the year 1893, that Dwight L. Moody and his workers were gathered at the close of the day for a word of prayer. They usually sang a hymn before praying, and the hymn announced was "I Need Thee Every Hour." When the singing was done, Mr. Henry Varley, an English evangelist, said: "I'm not sure that I can subscribe heartily to that sentiment. I feel that I need Christ moment by moment."

The thought impressed Major D.W. Whittle, and at the close of the prayer session he went to his room. There he wrote and rewrote until at about two o'clock in the morning, a new hymn was completed – "Moment By Moment."

We can trust God's sustaining grace – a security that we can rely upon every moment of the day. God has promised to be with us always, throughout our earthly existence, and until the time we stand in God's presence ('till glory doth shine.)

Verse three of the hymn reminds us that no matter our life's circumstance, God understands and is ever ready to sustain us.

"Never a trial that He is not there.

Never a burden that He does not bear,

Never a sorrow that He does not share,

Moment by moment, I'm under His care."
