FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Members and Friends of Old Saratoga,

David, Mikael and I want to thank many of you for your thoughts, prayers, hugs, cards and e-mails which were a great comfort to us during our recent family bereavement. Early Sunday morning, August 24, my sister Patti in Michigan called with the sad news that her husband (our brother-in-law) Steve Allen, 61, died at home following an unexpectedly rough week. Many of you had been praying for Steve and Patti and their family over the past year and a half, since Steve was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in March, 2013. He had been on Hospice care for only a few weeks before he died.

HYMN OF THE MONTH

"Sing to the Lord, you saint of his; praise his holy name. (Psalm 30: 4)

"Where Cross the Crowded Ways of Life"

"Where cross the crowded ways of life, Where sound the cries of race and clan, Above the noise of selfish strife We hear your voice, O Son of Man!"

In the early twentieth century, Frank M. North was challenged by an editor of hymnals to write a hymn text on city missions. The Methodist Church had come to the realization that missions were not only foreign, but that a message of life and hope was needed in our domestic urban environments. Frank North was not a hymn writer, but had vast knowledge of the challenges of urban life in his work for the Methodist Church in New York City. The hymn was inspired by Jesus' words found in Matthew 22:9: "Go to the street corners and invite to the banquet anyone you find." The text focuses on the ills of our great urban centers, the "melting pots" with many thousands living in squalid conditions, almost hopelessly struggling against the "lures of greed" and the "noise of strife."

The hymn is as applicable today as it was in 1905. Although our society has gone a long way to clean up many of the slum conditions of the early twentieth century, more folks that ever live in urban areas where greed, disparity in wealth, and crime are very much a part of every day life. The message of Matthew 11:28- "Come unto me, all you who are weary and burdened and I will give you rest" needs to be heard.

As I think upon the message of this hymn, I find that it applies to all of us, regardless of our living environment. The challenges of life in a modern society "crowd" the streets of our minds and spirits. The challenges of our vocations, avocations, tending to and supporting family, the need to remain current on national and world affairs, and the time absorbed in tending to social media compete, and often leave little time for evangelism and the need for spiritual nourishment. The spiritual challenge to believers and the church remain as found in verse 4 of North's hymn:

"Till all the world shall learn God's love And follow where God's feet have trod; Till glorious from God's throne above Shall come the city of our God."
