From the Pastor...

Dear Members and Friends of Old Saratoga,

On Sunday, May 3, the time of worship at Old Saratoga will change from 10:30 A.M to 10:00 A.M. A half hour difference may not seem like much, but when it comes to change in the church, everything merits careful consideration! I thank the Worship Committee and Consistory for taking the time needed to explain why a change was needed and to listen to the opinions of the congregation.

For those who might not know, Old Saratoga and Notre Dame-Visitation Roman Catholic Church in Schuylerville share the same organist, Barbara Elcox. Barbara is a communicant of Notre-Dame Visitation and Director of Music there, but we think of her as an "honorary" member of Old Saratoga. She has been with us a long time and her faithful, ecumenical spirit has served both churches well.

Several months ago, Notre Dame-Visitation made a decision to change their Sunday morning worship time to accommodate their priest, Father Marty's new schedule. Their revised time overlapped with ours, making it necessary for us to change our time in order that Barbara can play at both churches on Sunday morning.

We are grateful and glad that it worked out as it did. In some ways it turned out to be a blessing in disguise in that many of you think the earlier time will be better!

Gathering on Sunday mornings to worship God is one of the most meaningful things the church does. Being together for worship allows us to be formed and shaped by God's Word as disciples of Jesus Christ; it helps create a community of faith and love where all people are accepted and included, where they can voice their questions, grow in faith, pray for each other and the world, share the joys and the sorrows that are part of all our lives.

From the dawn of early civilizations, people on earth have come together to worship. Christian mystic and scholar, Evelyn Underhill, worte in her classic book <u>Worship</u>, that "Worship in all its grades and kinds, is the response of the creature to the Eternal." (p.3) "There is a sense" she said, "in which we may think of the whole life of the Universe, seen and unseen, conscious and unconscious, as an act of worship, glorifying its Origin, Sustainer and End...For worship is an acknowledgment of Transcendence."

Worship for me is not as much about what we do or say, but more about being encountered and engaged by the Holy One who made us, who loves us forever, who calls us to help bring comfort and healing to a broken world. In worship we come to say "Thank you"...and then listen for the still small Voice, that sometimes surprising, and often mysterious message that works its way into our hearts and gives life to our souls.

So "Come, make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth! Worship the Lord with gladness...give thanks to Him, bless his name! For the Lord is good, and his steadfast love endures forever!" (Psalm 100)

HYMNS OF OUR FAITH

As the season of Fastertide draws to a close we continue to rejoice at the wonder of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Death has met defeat and our salvation is complete. The English hymn writer Christopher Wordsworth was inspired to write this hymn based on St. Paul's resurrection discourse in 1 Corinthians 15: 1-28. It seems that there were some who said there was no resurrection. In his sermon the Apostle recounts the proof of the resurrection in that Jesus appeared to Peter and then later to more than five hundred Paul boldly proclaims, ""For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive." This is the hope that we have in the resurrection that is yet to come.

"Stanza 1 proclaims praise to God for the fact of Jesus' resurrection, stanza 2 emphasizes the impact of Christ's victory and the final stanza is the great Trinitarian doxology."

"Alleleuia, Alleluia! Glory be to God on high!
Alleluia to the Savior who has gained the victory!
Alleluia to the Spirit, fount of love and sanctity!
Aleluia, Alleluia to the Triune Majesty!"

FILE OF LIFE

Thanks to Women's Guild members, **Sue** Hughes and Joan Lapitsky, we have "File of Life" kits in the church office for anyone who would like one. The File of Life is provided by the Saratoga County Office for the Aging. Used in times of emergency, it is a small paper which the holder fills out and keeps in his/her refrigerator freezer. The information recorded includes emergency contacts, medications, medical conditions, allergies, medical insurance information, and DNR directives. This is especially important for older people who live alone. In the event of an emergency, when an individual is unable to speak or respond, first responders would look for the File of Life information, which can help to save a life.

CROP WALK Sun. May 3

CROP (Communities Responding to Overcome Poverty) is part of Church World Service (CWS) a cooperative Christian organization that works to end hunger and poverty, and respond to disaster around the world. They also help to resettle refugees and promote justice and peace. Part of the money collected from local CROP walks goes to CWS and a portion is given to the local food pantries, such as SAFER and the Greenwich Food Pantry.
