From the Pastor.....

"Joy to the world! The Lord is come; Let earth receive her King; Let every heart prepare him room, And heaven and nature sing."

Dear Members and Friends of Old Saratoga,

Greetings to you in the grace and peace of Christ!
We'll soon be singing the words of the carol above, "Joy to the World!" as Advent begins on Sunday, December 3 and prepares the way for the celebration of Christ's birth on December 25.

"Joy to the world" speaks a hopeful message not only for the Christmas season, but also for the troubling times in which we live, and the personal challenges we face. "Do not be afraid," the angel said to the shepherds. "I bring you good news of **great joy** that will be for all people." (Luke 2: 10)

I've just finished reading <u>The Book of Joy</u>, given to me by a friend last Christmas. The book is about a week- long dialogue between His Holiness, the Dalai Lama (exiled Buddhist leader of Tibet) and Archbishop Desmond Tutu, (Christian leader in South Africa during the long oppressive years of apartheid (racial segregation) Both men are highly regarded as great spiritual and moral leaders in the world who have lived through deep suffering and countless challenges to their beliefs and faith.

These two men are in their older years now. Both are known and admired for the joy they express in the way they think and live, despite their life circumstances. Archbishop Tutu said that "Joy is much bigger than happiness. While happiness is often seen as being dependent on external circumstances, joy is not."

According to both men, joy is a state of heart and mind that transcends despair and cynicism, thus making it possible to be joyful in the midst of hardship, crisis, grief and suffering – both our own and the world's.

Jesus was born into a world where trouble and suffering are inevitable – and he endured both; but the wonder and Gift of his life continues to be "news of great JOY for all people." Why? Jesus knew joy because he was filled with love for his God and others. Toward the end of his life he said to his disciples: "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love....I have told you this so that MY JOY may be in you, and YOUR JOY may be complete." (John. 15: 9-11)

The more joyful people there are, the more joy there will be in the world! Joy is a gift of God's love; and no matter what happens, joy is indestructible; and as Jesus showed us in his life, when our hearts and minds are full of love for God and others, the joy spreads and brings life to us and all the world!

May Joy be God's gift to you this Christmas, and your gift to others!

This traditional German carol retells one of the glorious events surrounding the birth of Jesus as recorded by St. Luke Ch. 2. On the night of Christ's birth, shepherds in the Holy Land were doing what they did every night – watching their sheep lest a predator should attack, or a hireling attempt to enter the fold and steal.

The act of "watching" was a perennial task for God's chosen people, whether it be in protecting their possessions, such as their sheep, watching and waiting for deliverance from an oppressive foe, or watching and waiting for the coming of God's promised one, the Messiah.



But on this night the shepherds were to be witnesses to an announcement, long anticipated, that would change the course of history-news that on that night a child would be born "who shall redeem us all."

This carol, so easy to sing, is truly one of the most joyful carols in hymnody. It is to be sung robustly as we join with countless others, over many ages, who have thrilled to the news and the great importance of the birth of Emmanuel, God with us.
