From Pastor Jenn...

It has now been a little over two months since I started with the Turning Point Churches Ministry. So much has happened since then that it seems a lot longer! This time has brought a lot of change, but blessings as well. Being in a new place can be hard at first, but life giving as well, if we stop to listen for God's voice and the call he places on our lives in the stillness. I look back over the last six years and see how God was at work in my life, preparing me for the next step in my journey. It is not always easy to see that in the here and now. I am thankful for a loving, faithful and merciful God. No matter what we are doing, He continually shows us that he is ever present in our lives, no matter what we are doing or where we are going.

A few weeks ago I preached on the story of the Magi, from Matthew 12: 1-11. The sermon title was "Star of Wonder." As many times as I have read and heard that story, I never saw the significance of the star in that passage. I always thought the Magi were the main characters, but without the star, would the Magi have found Jesus? As I pondered the significance of the star, I thought of the song lyrics, "Star of wonder, star of night, star with royal beauty bright. Westward leading, still proceeding, guide us to thy perfect light." How often do we pay attention to the stars in the sky? As a child, I remember lying in the grass, looking up at the bright stars in the sky, wondering about the mysteries of the universe. This big, beautiful star lit up the darkness of the night sky and illuminated the path for the Magi. What if we are called to be like the Magi and follow the star? What would the journey look like?

We may not always know where God is leading us, but we are called to follow the light. Because the light has come into the world, darkness shall not overcome it. The journey the Magi set out on was one filled with mystery and wonder, but they followed the star to find the Christ child. As witnesses of the faith, we are called to embark on this journey, and trust where the star is leading us. For me, it has been overcoming my anxiety and fears to really listen to God's call and live in the mystery and wonder as I followed the path to NY.

My time here has been filled with love and joy. The three congregations have been hospitable and caring, and God has blessed my life by calling me to be a part of them. Each congregation is unique, and grounded in their individuality, but is working towards being together as a team. My ministry is unique, and we are creating as we go. I have had the opportunity to share a lot: leading worship, consistory meetings, coffee hours, planning Advent, Lent and an ecumenical MLK events, visiting nursing homes, working at food pantries, as well as getting involved in a local non-profit. This is only the first two months. I cannot wait to see what God has in store for the next two years!

May God's light forever be a guiding light in your lives and ministry, and may the love of God, the peace of Christ, and the presence of the Spirit be with each of you as you journey in the New Year!

2017 FINANCIAL UPDATE

Thank you to everyone who supported the ministry of Old Saratoga during 2017. God blesses our church with each gift. Our income actually exceeded our expectations, which meant that we were able to withdraw less money (\$14,000 instead of \$18,000) from our investment profits.

Our operating expenses also exceeded our budget, particularly for maintenance of our church and parsonage. We are grateful that lower costs in other areas allowed us to take care of many needed projects that were recommended by the Property Committee, as well as a few urgent needs. We also used \$3000 from our investment fund to renovate the bathroom off the kitchen. HYMNS OF OUR FAITH

"Sing to the Lord, you saints of his: praise his holy name." Psalm 30:4

"Thou Didst Leave Thy Throne and thy kingly crown When thou camest to earth for me;
But in Bethlehem's home there was found no room For thy holy nativity."

There are essentially two reasons for writing a hymn – praise and instruction. "Thou didst leave thy throne" was written as instruction for school children by Emily E.S. Elliot. The hymn story traces the life of Christ from his birth, through time spent in the desert, his trial before Roman authorities, and the road to Calvary. Each of the first four stanzas begins with a note of acceptance, but ends with the notion of rejection that Jesus knew throughout his time on earth. The last stanza (vs. 5) closes extolling the day of Christ's return to gather his saints. Two refrains are attached to the hymn. The first is sung following the first four stanzas. It is the singer's prayer of acceptance – the singer's personal invitation to Jesus to make his or her heart his dwelling place. The second refrain, following the tone of verse 5, speaks of the joy to be experienced at our Lord's return.

Little is known about Emily Elliot, and it may be that this was the only hymn that she wrote or that survives in the hymnary of our day. We do know more about the composer of the tune that is married to Emily's prose. Timothy R. Matthews was an Anglican clergyman who wrote over 100 hymn tunes. Carrying through on a particular request for a children's hymnal, it is said that Matthews completed six tunes in one day.

It is unfortunate that this hymn is largely reserved for the Christmas season. It is a hymn for all seasons, and is applicable to Christmas, Holy Week, Ascension, and when addressing Jesus' earthly ministry.

At times, consistent with the frailty of our human nature, we are prone to reject Jesus' entrance into our lives, perhaps passively, but excluding him, nonetheless. We fail to fully accept the magnitude of the love of God and the fact that we are such an important part of sharing his love with others. May our desire and endless prayer ever be, "O come to my heart, Lord Jesus, there is room in my heart for thee."
