### From Pastor Joyce...

"Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here...

But go tell his disciples and Peter that he (Jesus) is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you."

Mark 16:6-7

Dear Members and Friends of Old Saratoga,

Greetings to you and your families in the grace and peace of Christ!

We're almost mid-way through the holy season of Lent. Easter (April 1) is still a few weeks away, but we're already thinking ahead to the great celebration of Christ's Resurrection! It may be similar to how we are still living with winter, but anticipating the coming of spring.

This Lenten season is a time when we "look for Jesus." Not in the sense that he's gone and where is he? But in the sense that we will "see" him at work in our lives, with us in our pain and suffering, present in our moments of doubt, and encouraging us to love each other as we are all so loved by God. He has called us to follow him—to keep our eyes on him, in order that we can go where he leads and help do our part in the building of God's Kingdom on earth!

Looking for Jesus is an act of faith, believing that the Risen Christ is here with us as he promised he would be. We look for him when we worship with his body the church; when we come together for worship with the ecumenical community; when we gather with others to read the Bible or learn about daring and devoted disciples like Bishop Desmond Tutu; we look for Jesus when we eat the bread and drink the cup; when we walk beside a loved one or friend who is hurting or suffering. We look for Jesus when we look within ourselves.

The grieving women who were looking for Jesus on Easter morning presumed him dead and were looking for his body so they could anoint it with oils and spices. They remind us that sometimes it is possible we look for Jesus, but don't really expect to find him or that his presence will be real.

Yet, on that first Easter morning, the women find out that Jesus was raised, and not only was he alive, but he was going ahead of them to Galilee—and there they would see him! The mystery of God's intervention, in what had seemed a sad and hopeless situation, rendered them speechless and afraid as they fled the garden where their beloved Jesus had been entombed. Was it really possible that they would see him again and feel the joy of his presence?

And so goes the great story of Easter...that Christ is not only alive, but goes ahead of us; and if he is truly walking ahead of us, we will not look for him in vain, but we will "see" him" –in the world and in our lives--just as he told us.

May the Living Christ who goes before us lead us through Lent to a joyous Easter!

#### HYMNS OF OUR FAITH

"Sing to the Lord, you saints of his: praise his holy name." Psalm 30:4

"Take time to be holy, speak oft with thy Lord;
Abide in him always, and feed on God's Word.
Make friends of God's children;
Help those who are weak,
Forgetting in nothing his blessing to seek."

We have arrived at the Season of Lent. In the liturgical year, this is a time of preparation and renewal, often encouraging us to give up something that brings joy to our lives. Self-denial for the sake of sacrifice alone does not profit, but it should be our desire that the void filled by relinquishing something will be filled by something more glorious that more fully prepares, that more fully equips us, for God's service.

Jesus, in preparation for his earthly ministry, recognized the need to separate himself from daily life in order to equip himself for the work ahead. Spending 40 days in the desert, dealing with temptations from Satan, Jesus fasted and prayed. "Take Time to Be Holy," although not a Lenten hymn, contains elements of the Lenten theme. It speaks to our need to prepare, to pray and always be in a spirit of prayer. It speaks of our spiritual need to "feed on God's word." It speaks of the "world rushing on" while we spend time alone with God.

(This hymn was written by W.D. Longstaff and the hymn tune was composed by G.C. Stebbins, the first being an Englishman, and the second a native New Yorker who also wrote the tunes to "Have Thine Own Way" and "Jesus, I Come.")
