HYMNS OF OUR FAITH

"Sing to the Lord, you saints of his: praise his holy name." Psalm 30:4

"There's a quiet understanding when we're gathered in the Spirit;

It's a promise that he gives us, when we gather in his name.

There's a love we feel in Jesus, there's a manna that he feeds us:

It's a promise that he gives us, when we gather in his name."

When I think about the "great" hymns of the church, so many of which I have written about for Jacob's Well, I discover that most of the lyrics were written in the 19th century, often by pastors and theologians, and have been set to music written by well-known composers of even earlier times.

There's a Quiet Understanding" is the exception to previous articles. It is a wonderful hymn with a folk music feeing, written in the 1970's. It was inspired by an informal communion service which 12 people shared in a hotel room in Oakland, CA. following a Crusade service. The composer of both lyrics and song tune was Edward "Tedd" Smith, an associate of the Billy Graham team.

Tedd Smith said, "As we sat in a circle on the floor sharing communion, the feeling of being strangers disappeared and there seemed to come to a quiet understanding of each other, a feeling of being brothers and sisters and seeing the oneness Christ promised whenever two or three gather in his name." 11

The thoughts and feelings engendered by the opening verse are continued in the second and closing verse, which reads as follows:

"And we know when we're together, sharing love and understanding.

That our brothers and our sisters feel the oneness that he brings.

Thank you, thank you, Jesus, for the way you love and feed us,

For the many ways you lead us, thank you, thank you, Lord."

Sherry is a cousin of **Kim Thayer**, member of Old Saratoga. She and Glenn are residents of western NY, but spend part of their year in their other home in the Dominican Republic.

Sherry has graciously accepted our invitation to come and tell us about the work of the **Mariposa DR Foundation**. Last fall, at our annual congregational meeting, we voted to support the Mariposa DR Foundation as one of our four Missions of the Quarter.

The Mariposa Foundation began in 2009 with the goal of working "to end extreme generational poverty" and to assist women and girls, especially, that are not "looking for a handout, but a hand up."

The Mariposa Center for Girls in the DR was established to educate, empower and employ girls from the Dominican Republic and neighboring Haiti. You can find more information by going to www.mariposadrfoundation.org.

Sherry will be telling us more about her unique contribution that has to do with teaching girls to sew. She will also share with us the opportunities that exist for supporting the Mariposa DR with not only dollars, but with the collection of items needed, and a possible mission trip to the DR.
