From Pastor Jenn...

Dear Members and Friends of Old Saratoga,

Well, it has now been almost eight months since I moved here to NY to do ministry with the Turning Point Ministry Churches. One of my favorite things to do during my Sabbath time is to take a drive through the countryside. I love seeing the farmers tilling the land, planting, baling hay, and the animals roaming the land. These experiences/drives bring back some of my favorite childhood memories. My grandfather rode his tractors, tilled the land, planted seeds, and cared for his very large garden. I used to love watching him riding on his John Deere tractor doing these things. It also reminds me of when he brought us to a farm in Accord, NY where people would come from all over the area to help plant and harvest corn with the old plows and big draft horses. Experiencing these things as a child gave me a true appreciation for creation, animals, hard work, farmers, and to know where my food came from. As I am reminded of my early life formations, I think about how it shaped my understanding of who God is and our Creator's relationship with us and the world.

As I look out at acres of fields of tilled land, the farmers planting seeds in the ground, I think about how God has created the land, humanity, work, seeds and the rain and sunshine that nourish the seeds. God is Creator of all things. I have been reading a devotion book by Ann Voskamp, who is a farmer's wife. Her husband, the farmer, speaks of the seeds being nourished and the beauty of seeing the seeds break through the ground and grow into a plant. A mustard seed is like our faith. It is small and, through nurturing, grows and transforms over time. Like the seeds breaking through the tilled ground, our faith is being transformed and flourishes like a beautiful plant.

By reading scripture, praying, spending time with God, worshipping, doing mission/outreach work, the Holy Spirit is working in us to transform us, and working through us to plant seeds in other's lives. We never know how we are planting seeds of faith in other's lives by living as Christ has called us to as his faithful disciples. We are called to be Christ's witnesses to the world. We are called as Christians to live lives to glorify and praise God. In loving as Christ loved, extending grace, showing compassion, being inclusive, welcoming the stranger, helping the oppressed, the poor, the marginalized, and the prisoner, we are living as Christ's disciples and witnessing to our faith in Him. We may never know what happens after the seed is planted in someone's heart, but we do know that Christ abides in each of us and the Holy Spirit has been sent into our hearts.

One of my favorite songs is by country singer, George Strait. He writes, "Just walked down the street to the coffee shop, had to take a break. I've been by her side for eighteen hours straight. Saw a flower growing in the middle of the sidewalk, pushing up through the concrete like it was planted right there for me to see. The flashing lights, the honking horns all seem to fade away, but in the shadow of the hospital at 5:08, I saw God today. I've been to church. I've read the book. I know He's there, but I don't look near as often as I should. His fingerprints are everywhere. I just look down and stop and stare. Open my eyes and then I swear, I saw God today."

As we wander down the street, walk to go get a coffee or to just take a walk, when we visit the hospital to see a loved one or friend, when we drive down the road, wander through the countryside, sit at our desks at work, or talk to others, may our eyes be opened to see God. When we discover a flower blooming from the crack of the sidewalk, when we see the cow roaming the land, when we have a conversation with someone, see the blooming of flowers/plants, or hear a song, may we each see how God is at work in our lives and in the world each day and moment, and proclaim the Gospel and glorify God. May we feel the love of God, the peace of Christ in our hearts, and the presence and work of the Holy Spirit with us every day.

HYMNS OF OUR FAITH

"Sing to the Lord, you saints of his: praise his holy name." Psalm 30:4

"Like a river glorious is God's perfect peace.
Over all victorious in its bright increase.
Perfect yet it floweth fuller every day,
Perfect yet it groweth deeper all the way."

Living in the Village of Schuylerville by the great Hudson River one quickly becomes acquainted with the river's power and beauty. Following a storm, it surges towards its meeting with the sea. More often the river is peaceful and has a calming effect on its observer. In Isaiah 48: 18, the prophet voices the word of God: "If only you had paid attention to my commands, your peace would be like a river."

The author of our hymn is the English poet and hymn writer, Frances Havergal (1836-1879.) In her lifetime she lived near two rivers. Perhaps it was while sitting near the River Dee or the River Twae, in Wales, that the scripture –inspired words came to Haveraal. Able to read at age three, Frances began writing verse at age seven. She memorized the New Testament and several Old Testament books. Allusions to scriptural texts fill many of the nearly 100 hymns she wrote. Havergal said, "Writing is praying with me." 1 She lived a disciplined prayer life and it is said that she never wrote a line without first praying over it. "I believe my King suggests a thought, and whispers a musical line or two, and then look up and thank him delightedly and go on with it. That is how my hymns come." 2

Although highly educated and cultured, Frances' life was not devoid of human sorrow. Through each trial she maintained a simple faith and confidence in her Lord. The third verse of the hymn states, "We may trust him fully all for us to do; those who trust him wholly, find him wholly true." We have reason to believe that Frances Havergal fully realized "God's perfect peace."

The refrain is as follows:

"Stayed upon Jehovah, hearts are truly blest Finding, as he promised, perfect peace and rest."

GENERAL SYNOD

The RCA General Synod met from June 7-12 on the campus of Calvin College in Grand Rapids, MI. Calvin College is supported by the <u>Christian Reformed Church</u>, which was simultaneously having their General Synod. The two Reformed churches (which split in 1857) held worship together, discussed further levels of cooperation with the hope of someday becoming one united denomination.

Highlights:

The Rev. Eddy Aleman was elected 6th General Secretary of the RCA, effective 7/1/18

A 20/20 Vision Group to be formed to discuss the deep divisions in the RCA regarding LGBYQ/same gender acceptance and inclusion, reporting back to Synod in 2020 about being able to stay together or gracefully separate Room For All, a growing organization with the RCA, committed to the full inclusion of LGBTQ people organized an inclusive worship service for delegates and the community

Synod voted overwhelmingly in favor of recommendations of the <u>Commission on Women</u> in response to the We Are <u>Speaking</u> movement regarding harassment, abuse and sexual violence. The RCA will be developing a policy, education and training for congregations, consistories, classes and regional synods

General Synod directed the General Secretary to write a letter to President Trump supporting **immigration reform**, **and the DACA** (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals) and urged congregations to advocate for legislation that supports both

A paper "Ecumenism and the RCA" will be sent to all consistories and classes, who will be asked to give response to this question: "How is/are your congregation(s) engaging in ecumenical relationships with your community?"
