

# Church Life

#### HYMNS OF OUR FAITH

"Sing to the Lord, you saints of his: praise his holy name." Psalm 30:4
"Here, O my Lord, I see you face to face, Here faith can touch and handle things unseen; Here will I grasp with firmer hand your grace, And all my weariness upon you lean."

This hymn, written by Horatio Bonar, captures the essence of the Lord's Supper – that time in our worship when we commune with our Lord and with brothers and sisters in Christ around the elements associated with Christ's suffering on behalf of a broken world. Although we cannot physically see God, we do feel his presence as we "touch and handle things unseen." For many of us this feast of remembrance is the time when we feel closest to God, for it is the time when, as Bonar has written,, "Here will I lay aside each earthly load, here taste afresh the calm of sin forgiven."

Horatio Bonar (1808-1889) is viewed as the greatest of Scottish hymn writers, descended from a long line of pastors, who in aggregate served 364 years in the Church of Scotland. Horatio was an avid Bible student and excelled in preaching and hymn writing. Many of his hymns were described as "spontaneous." In all, he wrote nearly 600 hymns, 100 of which are still in use in English speaking countries.

Once a year Horatio visited his brother, to celebrate the Lord's Supper. At one of these visits he gave his brother this hymn, which originally had eleven verses. The stanzas take us through the physical act of communion, a statement o confessing the sinner's condition and God's righteousness, God's presence after we have left the table, and closes with an image of the feast that awaits all believers, which reads as follows:

"Feast after feast thus comes and passes by, Yet, passing points to that glad feast above; Giving sweet foretaste of the festal joy, The Lamb's great bridal feast of bliss and love."
