From the Pastor...

"Beloved, let us love one another for love is from God." I John 4:7

Dear Members and Friends of Old Saratoga,

Greetings to you in the grace and peace of Christ!

Valentine's Day will soon be here on February 14! It's never long after Christmas, when the store-shelves are being re-stocked with red or pink heart-shaped boxes of candy; and Valentine's Day cards and lovely flowers will be sent and given to express love. It all began centuries ago with a kindly man who became known as **St. Valentine**, a priest who was imprisoned in Rome in the 3rd century for aiding persecuted Christians.

I am thinking of another saint, **Dorothy Day** (1897-1980) who's been called "a saint for our times". She was known for her love of Christ and humanity—especially those people who lived at the margins of society. Years ago, I read her autobiography entitled <u>"The Long Loneliness.</u>" I also have a small, treasured book of her writings entitled <u>The Reckless Way of Love: Notes on Following Jesus, published in 2017.</u>

Though I never met her, Dorothy Day has been a spiritual mentor for me—as she has been for countless people. What I find so compelling about her, is her intense desire to know Jesus and to follow his teachings and example in her own life.

Her own journey of faith was fairly unorthodox, for in her early years she had left religion behind to engage in a life of activism. Later on, she fully embraced the Catholic faith and found a way to integrate it with social action. She and her friend, Peter Maurin, founded the Catholic Worker Movement which supported "houses of hospitality in New York City where everyone was welcome—especially those who were addicts, homeless, poor, or destitute.

With her life of service and her deep belief in the God-given dignity of all people, she gave new meaning to the word "love". In this world of "tension and strife", as she described it, she was often asked, "What good can one person do? She answered it this way: "We can beg for an **increase of love in our hearts** that will vitalize and transform all our individual actions, and know that God will take them and multiply them, as Jesus multiplied the loaves and the fishes."

Through her remarkable legacy of love and service, Dorothy Day invites us to a deeper level of loving, centered in the inexhaustible love of God for all beings and creation. She believed with all her heart and soul that **"love is from God"**, and that our highest purpose in life is to **"love one another."** (I John 4:7)

My family and I want to thank you all for your faithful love and care for us, and to express our joy in loving you and sharing with you the ministry of Love for one another and for all God's children!

The congregation extends its sympathy and prayers to the family and friends of Susanna ("Susie") Flanders Brownell Murphy (97) who died on January 14, 2020 at the Center for Nursing and Rehabilitation in Hoosick Falls, NY. Susie had been a member of Old Saratoga for 87 years. She joined the church by Confession of Faith on Christmas Eve, 1933. Throughout that time (except for the years she lived in Vermont) she was actively involved in church fund-raisers and programs, and the Women's Guild. She served for many years as a volunteer at the Community Food Pantry (which eventually became SAFER) as the Manager, giving help and assistance to hundreds of families and individuals. She had to "retire" from this work at age 90 when she broke her hip. Susie came from a family of thirteen children- and she herself had eight children, three of whom preceded her in death. We remember in prayer her five living children: Susan, Rose, Nelson, Robert and Scott and their families. along with twenty-three grandchildren and numerous great-grandchildren and great-great grandchildren.

A Service of Christian Burial for Susie was held on January 18 at the church at her request, with a bereavement reception following for family and friends. Her committal will be this coming spring at Prospect Hill Cemeterv.

HYMNS OF OUR FAITH

"Sing to the Lord, ye saints of God." Psalm 30: 4 Jesus, Come! For We Invite You "Jesus, come! For we invite you, guest and master, friend and Lord; Now as once at Cana's wedding, speak and let us hear your word: Lead us through our need or doubting, hope be born and joy restored."

This hymn, written in 1979, was composed for the season of Epiphany by Christopher Idle, a clergyman in the Church of England. Epiphany, as a liturgical season, celebrates the manifestation of the divine nature of Jesus and includes events such as the Visit of the Magi and the Wedding in Cana. "Jesus, Come! For We invite You" draws upon the miracle at Cana where Jesus turned water into wine; wine that was declared to be the best wine served that day. The wine at a Jewish festival was a symbol of joy.

In this hymn, Christopher Idle prays that this same Jesus will intervene in our lives to restore our joy. In the second and third verses the writer asks Jesus to "transform our pleasures," "guide us into paths unknown," "come in new creation," and "rouse the faith of your disciples."

A writer of over two hundred hymns, Christopher Idle served on many hymnal projects, and was well-known for his articles on a Christian's public responsibilities.

"Jesus, come! Surprise our dullness, make us willing to receive more than we can yet imagine, all the best you have to give; Let us find your hidden riches, taste your love, believe and live!"

Thank you to everyone who supported the ministry of Old Saratoga during 2019. God blesses our church with each gift. Our donations were down significantly, which meant we had to cash in more investment income than anticipated. Fortunately, our investments did well and we were able to meet all of our financial obligations by the end of the year.

Our operating expenses also exceeded our budget, particularly for fund raising expenses, as we tried new fund raisers that had initial costs but were profitable, and for the maintenance of our church and parsonage. We are dedicated to taking care of our buildings in order to prevent more expensive repairs in the future.

We continue to support both local and global missions with the money that is given specifically for that purpose. We do not use general donations or fund raisers for mission work. We gave **\$5047.05** to the groups we support and ended the year with over **\$9000** of mission funds which could be put to good use to help others.

We pray that God will continue to bless our ministry both locally and through our mission donations. Thank you for the support you offer through your prayers, gifts, time, and talents.
