From the Pastor...

Dear Members and Friends of Old Saratoga, Greetings to you in the grace and peace of Christ!

The church is now in the 40-day season of Lent, which began on Feb. 26 with Ash Wednesday. Seasonally, Lent parallels the coming of Spring, when for us where we live, the cold, snow and ice of winter thaw and give way to the new cycle of life. This helps us to understand Lent as a season of spiritual renewal—a time to contemplate our mortal nature and the mystery of God's infinite Love revealed to the world in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

For over 35 years, the churches of our community have come together during Lent to worship God. When we gather we are Reformed, Methodist, Episcopal, Catholic and Assembly of God—but most importantly we are all followers of Jesus Christ who makes us one.

Each year, a theme is chosen by the clergy for the Ecumenical Community Lenten Worship Services. This year's theme is "*Transcendent Truth, a Reflection of Faith.*" This theme is based on the teachings of Jesus from The Gospel of John.

While the concept of "transcendent truth" may sound elusive and hard to grasp, we remember at the same time what Jesus said that "you will **know** the Truth and the truth will set you free." (John 8:32) This seems to say that the Truth of God is both beyond us and yet accessible to us through Christ who is the Living Truth.

Knowing the Truth is what most people desire; but in our present day, it's hard to sort out truth from falsehood. What passes for truth is often a distortion of truth or outright lies. When truth is compromised, society undergoes a moral and spiritual crisis; the confusion about who to trust undermines the very fabric of our life together.

Jesus said he had come "to testify to the truth" (meaning the Truth of God); and to those he said, "who belong to the truth, **listen to my voice**."

That is what we hope to do this Lent—to listen to the voice of Jesus, who embodied God's Truth, who lived his life by the truth. What he said and what he did show us the Truth that comes from God, by which we can discern truth from falsehood in our time. This Truth has everything to do with love and grace, forgiveness and reconciliation, dying (to false ways) and rising to new life!

May God's Spirit of Truth speak to us this Lent as we listen to the voice of Christ!

HYMNS OF OUR FAITH

"Sing to the Lord, ye saints of God." Psalm 30: 4

"More love to thee, O Christ, more love to thee:
Hear thou the prayer I make on bended knee;
This is my earnest plea: more love, O Christ to
thee, More love to thee, more love to thee."

The four verses of this hymn are a plea for more fervent love to Christ. The writer once wrote in her diary, "To love Christ more is the deepest need, the constant cry of my soul...when I am happy and busy, or when I am sad and idle, the whisper keeps going up for more love..." Greater love for Christ is that which displaces the momentary ills and pleasures of earthly existence. The hymn affirms the value of that greater love even in times of pain.

"The hymn was written by Elizabeth Prentiss (1818-78) during a time of physical suffering and family tragedy, with the deaths of two of her children. In her grief she began to meditate on God's dealings with Jacob in his times of sorrow and need, and on the hymn "Nearer My God to Thee" which was inspired by Jacob's dream at Bethel" The reader is encouraged to read about Jacob in Genesis 27: 41 - 28:18)

Here in the Lenten season the themes of self-denial, contrition, justice, and preparation for the day of resurrection are often in our thoughts. As we reflect upon what we must do to be more Christ-like in our thoughts and actions, we do well to first recognize that the basis for purity of thought and action, true repentance and justice are found in the seed of love that the Creator has implanted in us. If our love is to grow, if it is to be more effective, if it is to be witnessed and a benefit to others it will require "more love to Christ."²
