As the deVelder family continues to move their belongings from the parsonage, we are assessing its condition to determine what repairs are needed. We will share updates with the congregation as we receive them.

#### HYMNS OF OUR FAITH

"Sing to the Lord, ye saints of God." Psalm 30: 4

"To God be the glory, great things he hath done, So loved he the world that he gave us his Son, Who yielded his life an atonement for sin, And opened the life gate that all may go in."

Gratitude is our "grateful response to God's gift of grace, and it consists in two different acts: the dying-away of the old self and the rising of the new.<sup>1</sup> This hymn is a grand expression of praise to the one who has purchased our salvation, taught us his ways, and who will bring us to eternal life. "To God Be the Glory" is a hymn with lyrics by Fanny Crosby and music by William Howard Doane, first printed in 1875. Fanny Crosby, born in Putnam County, NY, was one of the most prolific hymnists in history, writing more than 8,000 hymns and gospel songs, despite being blind from shortly after birth.

In 1954, the song leader for Billy Graham was given a copy with the suggestion that "To God Be the Glory" be included in the songbook for the London Crusade. It was so well loved that he included it again that year in the Crusade in Nashville TN. The audience responded enthusiastically. The hymn quickly became well-known to Christians world-wide and is printed in most modern hymnals. To the good news in each stanza is added the refrain, reiterating gratitude and inviting other to join in praise.

"Praise the Lord, Praise the Lord, let the earth hear his voice! Praise the Lord, Praise the Lord, let the people rejoice! O come to the Father through Jesus the Son , And give him the glory, great things he hath done."
