Rett Zabriskie is a graduate of Earlham College (Indiana) and New Brunswick Seminary. The schools mirror his family history, as his mother is a New England Wheelock, and his father a Jersey Dutch Zabriskie. He was married to Astrid, from Boddum in Denmark, from 1973 until her death in 2007. He has children and grandchildren in Denmark, Arizona and Baltimore.

Rett has served the larger Church as staff for Metro New York Project Equality, and the American Bible Society. He has served the Reformed Church in America over the years as pastor, denominational executive, and Classis Stated Clerk. He has been the Interim Minister in 28 congregations.

PROPERTY MEETING

The Property Committee met on Jan. 14 and began the discussions about preparing the parsonage for our interim minister. Several items on the list have already been completed: we have a new electric stove coming from Parisi's; Doug Sheely has replaced the locks on the front and back doors, replaced the dangerous stairs to the basement, and removed the old clothesline pole in the back yard. He will soon begin to work on the walls in the parsonage study to ready it for Pastor Rett, and will be installing a post at the top of the stairs near the bathroom. The overgrown shrub/tree between the church and the parsonage has been removed and taken away.

The committee has had two licensed electricians come to give us bids on the electrical upgrades which need to be done to make the building safe.

The Property Committee extends its thanks to **Becca Sheely**, who, being a Structural Engineer, was generous with her professional time and expertise. She provided a list of recommendations for repairs to prevent further deterioration, to make the space livable, as well as some additional recommendations that could be done in the future.

The next meeting will be Monday, Feb. 1st at 7pm in the parsonage, to better assess what needs to be done next.

HYMNS OF OUR FAITH

"Sing to the Lord, you saints of his; praise his holy name." (Psalm 30:4)

Jesus, the Very Thought of Thee

"Jesus, the very thought of thee, with sweetness fills my breast. But sweeter far thy face to see, and in thy presence rest."

In a recent daily devotional reading, the story portrayed concerned a grandmother-tobe. The woman's daughter would soon give birth to a baby girl. The delightfully expectant grandmother described a feeling just shy of giddiness over the idea of holding the little one to her heart and softly singing to her. A visit to the baby section of a department store engendered images of caring for the child, and she thought, "I love you, little girl." And I haven't even seen you yet."

Upon reading this, I was reminded of the hymn "Jesus, the Very Thought of Thee." It also called into memory a verse of Scripture from 1 Peter 1:8: "Though you have not seen him (Jesus) you love him, and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and are filled with an inexpressible and glorious joy."

The hymn comes from an ancient Latin poem of 42 verses, written in the 12th century. Its focus is entirely on Christ, and his saving love, a love which gives hope, joy, and rest to Christ believers, and a love which excels any human love." ¹ Consider the third verse:

"O hope of every contrite heart, O joy of all the meek, To those who ask, how kind thou art, how good to those who seek."

Jesus, the Word, the second person of the Trinity, is the central figure in the life and thoughts of believers. As the gospel writer John tell us, "All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being." (John 1: 3) Jesus, although unseen by us, is the one we meet throughout the pages of Scripture. Jesus is the one we will see, our thoughts and hope realized, on that day when he returns for his saints.

"Jesus our only joy be thou, as thou our prize will be; In thee be all our glory now, and through eternity."

2020 FINANCIAL UPDATE

Thank you to everyone who supported the ministry of Old Saratoga during 2020. God blesses our church with each gift. In a year that included the retirement of our pastor and a pandemic, you came through for our ministry. Donations exceeded what we had expected and our expenses were lower than budgeted.

Although we had to take out more investment income than budgeted to get through the first half of the year, we ended the year with money in our account and all of our bills and mission donations paid. We were grateful to receive a PPP loan from the federal government which allowed us to continue paying our employees during the first few months of the pandemic shut-down. Although we are still waiting for information about applying to have our loan forgiven, and are optimistic that we will not have to repay it, we have funds available should it need to be repaid.

We saved money this year by using less energy during the shut-down and contracting with Nexamp to provide us with solar power in an effort to not only save money, but also to help the environment. We also saved money on pulpit supply by having 9 church members who were willing to lead worship.

As we begin a new year, we are beginning to plan for the renovation of the parsonage and the first steps in searching for a new pastor. The pulpit supply schedule is completed through Easter and we look forward to welcoming our new interim, Pastor Rett Zabriskie,

We continue to support both local and global missions with the money that is given specifically for that purpose and the money from bottle and can recycling. We do not use general donations or fund raisers for mission work. We hope to continue collecting bottles and cans, but are in need of additional volunteers to recycle them. Please let Duffy know if you can help in this way.

We pray that God will continue to bless our ministry both locally and through our mission donations. Once again, thank you for the support you offer through your prayers, gifts, time, and talents.
