Musings in the Interim

Hello! (Almost!)

How does one meet new people in COVID time? For many folk, there is, and has been right along, a short answer – we don't! But there are, as always, exceptions. Old Saratoga Reformed Church is one of them. With the retirement of Joyce deVelder after 38 years, there is a meeting with a new minister coming, in spite of COVID.

Now, granted, this will not be a "real" new minister! "Real" ministers are part of the community. They normally live within five miles or so of the church building and they have other relationships in the community besides being the minister of the church. But still, this will be a "genuine" new minister! There are fewer of this kind than there are of "real" ministers and not every congregation gets to have one. In some areas of the Church they are called "Interim Ministers" and in some areas "Transitional Ministers." That is what Old Saratoga is getting in April when I am looking forward to joining you for a time as Interim Minister.

Why are we having an interim? Well, that is a good question! In some congregations, there is an obvious answer. In one of my past assignments, the minister committed suicide and everything fell apart. In another, a congregation accustomed to having both a minister and associate minister for the past 50 years suddenly found itself with none at all. In short, interim ministers are often working with congregations in crisis. But that is not Old Saratoga! Joyce has retired, but that is not a crisis. It is simply the normal course of human events. So why an interim for you? I think the best answer is, "To ensure that when a new 'real' minister comes to Old Saratoga, both minister and congregation will have a common, conscious awareness and understanding of God's calling for 21st century ministry." We all know that our world is changing. Maybe the pace is not really faster but it sure seems so. Things that were certainties and dependables a mere 20 years ago are either changed beyond recognition or no longer exist. The two essential questions of life – "What is real?" and "How do I fit in?" have few, if any, broadly shared answers in our current world. Likewise, how to be Church is now a valid question that needs answers appropriate to the circumstances of people and place.

So I am looking forward to spending some months with you – wondering together about who we are as God's children and what it is God would have Old Saratoga be about in the next few years. We will look at past and present, wonder a bit about worship, check to make sure we know just what the community – Schuylerville and surrounding- is actually like just now. As we get some ideas about that, we will begin looking for the "real" minister. By the time that person arrives, we all pray and hope COVID time will be well behind us. I am praying for you now and looking forward to our conversations.

HYMNS OF OUR FAITH

"Sing to the Lord, you saints of his; praise his holy name." Psalm 30:4

"And Can It Be That I Should Gain"

"And can it be that I should gain an interest in the Savior's blood? Died he for me, who caused his pain? For me, whom him to death pursues?

Amazing love! How can it be that thou, My God, shouldst die for me?"

This hymn, written by Charles Wesley, is considered one of the best-loved of his six thousand hymns. It was written in 1738 to celebrate Wesley's conversion to Christianity. The first verse, above, is inspired by Galatians 2:20.

Wesley expresses his conversion experience in the fourth stanza in terms of the Apostle Peter's escape from prison that we read about in Acts 12: 5-9.

"Long my imprisoned spirit lay fast bound in sin and nature's night. Thine eye diffused a quickening ray, I woke, the dungeon flamed with light. My chains fell off, my heart was free; I rose, went forth, and followed thee."

At the time of his conversion, Charles was convalescing in the home of a Mr. Bray. Charles heard a voice saying, "In the name of Jesus of Nazareth, arise and believe, and thou shalt be healed of all thy infirmities." The voice was likely Mr. Bray's sister who felt commanded to say these words in a dream. According to Anglican hymn writer Timothy Dudley-Smith, Charles got out of bed and opening his Bible read from the Psalms (40:3) "He has put a new song in my mouth, even praise unto our God." Wesley wrote, "I have found myself at peace with God and rejoiced in the hope of the love of Christ."

This hymn is especially applicable to the Lenten Season when we follow themes having to do with our human brokenness, mortality, and the need for the saving grace that God has shown us in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

DEACONS FUND FOR MARCHSupport for AIDS Housing Services

The entire mission of Support Ministries is the housing needs of people living with AIDS. They can be served by one of four programs of Support Services: either by residing in the Ahana House in Waterford, or in the Jim Perry Residence in Albany. Additionally, Project HELP provides temporary transitional housing, with the goal of achieving independent living. Last, there is an Advocacy Program, in which a case manager assists people living with AIDS to find permanent housing. Your donation will continue this work.

FIRST QUARTER MISSION

The Mission for the first quarter is Drilling for Hope, which was started in 2005 by Karen Flewelling. Since Karen pays her own travel, lodging and food expenses, 100% of donations go to well drilling endeavors and people. DFH provides water wells, and farm animals. Food, medicine and school supplies are also donated, along with the sponsoring of children who would otherwise not receive an education.
