Musings in the Interim

WHAT'S RISEN?

April 2021

Do you have a heaven you can use? As April begIns, we celebrate the Great Festival - Christ Risen. And we are full of the hope that the Resurrection gives. But I am finding that, when pressed, folk find it often difficult to articulate that hope. And that's because we don't have a heaven we can use.

The heaven we have is the one left to us by the Bible writers and the medieval mystics. St. John, in the book of Revelation, describes heaven in terms of a desert or island paradise - warm, sunny, lots of vegetation. How will the Eskimos fare there, not to mention the four or five of us who actually like the weather in New York? The medieval mystics, Dante being the chief, conjure an empyrean filled with music, vapoural beings, and intellectual delight. How will football fans fare there, not to mention farmers, metalworkers, and police officers? The whole idea of heaven as a place where we turn into angels, sit on clouds, and play harps is simply a reduction of the Bible and the medievals into an insipid blah that never attracted anyone.

We need a heaven we can use. What does God indeed intend? As always, Christ is the answer. Look at Jesus following the Resurrection! He lives a full human existence but with many plusses. Distance is no object - he goes from Emmaus to Jerusalem faster than a Star Trek transporter could do it. He can choose his location in creation, earth, sky, whatever. What were miracles before, walking on water, healing illness, are now normal activity.

It can not be that God only wants to resurrect "religious" people. He created them all and he loves them all. And his instructions at the beginning were clear - we are to get involved with one another and care for one another. To be companions with one another and with God.

So a heaven we can use will be life as God intended it - many cultures but no racism; food but no one starving; love but no one lonely. In the creeds we acknowledge "I believe in the resurrection of the body". That's <u>us</u> we are talking about, and the resurrection locus is heaven. Learning how to live there is a life long task for which preparatory seminars are held each Lord's Day at OSRC. I look forward to seeing you in your accustomed place.

They owned and operated a dairy farm south of Schuylerville, where Anna continued to live after Hans' death in Feb.'97.

For many years, Anna was busy raising her daughters, helping Hans with the farm, and, as a talented weaver, working her loom. Later on, she became active in the Saratoga YMCA and the Hudson Mohawk Weaver's Guild. She loved playing bridge with friends, reading, traveling, and going to concerts, plays and other cultural events.

Anna was actively involved at Old Saratoga Reformed Church for over 40 years. She came to church almost every Sunday and was a long-time member of the Women's Guild and Fellowship Committee. She visited people who were home alone or hospitalized, and sent cards, in addition to giving hundreds of hours as a volunteer at church dinners and other gatherings and events.

HYMNS OF OUR FAITH

"Sing to the Lord, you saints of his; praise his holy name." Psalm 30:4 "Come Share the Lord" "We gather here in Jesus' name, his love is burning in our hearts like living flame; For through his loving Son, the Father makes us one; Come, take the bread, come drink the wine, come share the Lord."

In 1984, English born hymnwriter Bryan Jeffrey Leech thought to write a communion anthem. He first invented a melody but was having difficulty coming up with the lyrics. He struggled for more than six months. However, upon visiting a musician friend in California, he played the tune and asked for a reaction. The friend then said, "It's obvious: holy communion." Within moments the words were completed. The song is now his most popular and is sung in many denominational settings. You can find it on You Tube and witness its worldwide popularity.

Each of the three verses presents a theme, each exhibits the spiritual intimacy of the Lord's Supper. Verse 1, We gather in Jesus name and everyone is welcome. Verse 2, Jesus joins us. He is risen, and he breaks the bread, we are a family. Verse 3, We'll gather in the glory of our Lord and King and enjoy an everlasting feast. The observance of the Lord's Supper binds the family of God. It is a time when we can set aside our differences and be as one- the visible body of Christ. "We engage together with thanksgiving, in a holy remembrance of the death of Christ our Savior, and as we thus confess our taith."¹

"We'll gather soon where angels sing, we'll see the glory of our Lord and coming King; Now we anticipate the feast for which we wait: Come, take the bread, come drink the wine, come share the Lord. We are now a family of which the Lord is head, Though unseen he meets us here in the breaking of the bread."
