Musings in the Interim

Summertime, and the livin' is

June 2021

Solstice is past and Summer has begun, even though the temperatures during May and June often made it feel like Summer has been here a while. How will summer livin' be for OSRC?

George Gershwin sang that summer livin' is easy. I do pray and hope that your summer will be re-creating and filled with family and relaxing activities. I also pray and hope that your summer can provide some space for reflection on our life at OSRC. I have been spending these first three months getting to know you. Many, many thanks for the hospitality shared by the many whom I have now met. I look forward to having had some visit time with everyone eventually, but not now until the Fall. For now, I am looking forward to spending time in Denmark, with family and friends of course, but I am also looking at some re-creating. Covid canceled continuing education last year, but the option is back this year. I will be spending four days at Løgumkloster Refugium with about 25 others reflecting on the theme "The Unpredictable Life". Covid also canceled any big celebration of my 80th last year, so I spent the day at Sankt Birgitta Kloster with the Sisters of St. Bridget instead. There are about eight cloisters in Denmark that still have monks or nuns active in them and most offer overnight accommodations and opportunity to join them at the 6 - 8 daily worship services. It was a nourishing experience and I plan to do it again this year - and probably for every birthday I have left. I do pray and hope that the OSRC family will also have both some relaxing times and some re-creating ones as well.

When we return in the Fall, we will begin the work of transitioning to a new pastor. I am planning a number of congregational activities for the Fall and there will be more detail about that in the September Jacobs Well. For now, it is enough to say that we will be doing two big things and two little things. The two big things are, first, some serious and indepth conversation about how we as individuals and as a congregation experience God. The second will be about what we do together on Sunday mornings and how that activity can help all experience God more. The two little things both have to do with a new minister: what does an OSRC minister do to be effective; what are the practical parameters for employing a minister.

HYMNS OF OUR FAITH

"Help Us Accept Each Other"

"Help us accept each other as Christ accepted us. Teach us as sister, brother each person to embrace.

Be present Lord, among us and bring us to believe. We are ourselves accepted and meant to love and live."

In a letter to the Christians in Rome the Apostle Paul wrote these words: "Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor." (Romans 12:9-10)

"Help Us Accept Each Other" is a contemporary hymn written by Fred Kaan. Kaan was a minister in the Congregational Church in Britain who sought to address issues of peace and justice. He is best known as a prolific hymn writer and translator.

Fred Kaan was of Dutch origin. He lived through the Nazi occupation of the Netherlands and saw three of his grandparents die of starvation. He witnessed his parents' deep involvement in the resistance movement which included providing hiding places for Jews.¹

"Help Us Accept Each Other" is particularly applicable to our present dilemma as we experience a divided nation, intolerance, racial discrimination, and inexplicable acts of violence. The Apostle's admonition to "outdo one another in showing honor" strikes hard at a time when it is sport to tear others down. What could be more contrary to the commandment to "love each other as we love ourselves?"

"Teach us, O Lord, your lessons, as in our daily life We struggle to be human and search for hope and faith.

Teach us to care for people, for all, not just for some, To love them as we find them, or as they may become."

2021 MIDYEAR FINANCIAL UPDATE

Thank you to everyone who continues to support the ministry of Old Saratoga. We are so grateful for each and every gift as they allow us to continue serving God both here in Schuylerville and throughout the world with our local and global missions.

We have taken money out of our investments to finance the renovations of the parsonage but have not had to withdraw any money for our regular expenses. We were grateful to learn that our \$10,400 PPP Loan was fully forgiven by the federal government. This money was used primarily to cover payroll during the pandemic but also covered some utility costs. Our expenses have increased with the arrival of our transitional pastor so it is possible we may need to go back to withdrawing money from our investments as the year progresses.

We pray that God will continue to bless our ministry both locally and through our mission donations. Once again, thank you for the support you offer through your prayers, gifts, time, and talents.
