Musings in the Interim

A Fall Reflection on Spring

Some single days nourish whole years. A still remembered day in Spring was a "best kind of day just 'being.' " After the morning's Daily Office and a half hour of sermon refresh prep to fill in for an ill friend, I was ready to be outside in the 80 degree Spring sun, blazing through my window. Looking out, I realized I was still in the US. Many Danes wash their windows every week, and a few more often than that. (In America we don't wash windows, we replace them instead.) And I was suddenly aware that my windows needed something, so they got the Danish solution. (The Danes don't actually wash windows, they polish them. The tradesperson who does it is called a "vinduspuder", a window polisher.)

Beginning with the top sash, I noticed the dust level on top of the curtain approaching a weight that would soon occasion curtain defenestration. Into the washer with the curtains! Being at a height to remove the curtains revealed an equivalent dust on top of the pictures, while the angle showed the face of the pictures to be pretty dusty, too. And you know what I found on the walls after removing the pictures.

So, I spent the whole day on the simple task of having clean enough window(s) to enjoy the sun. At the end of the process, wine poured, I cut the now perfectly blooming lilac, read Whitman's poem When Lilacs Last in the Dooryard Bloom'd (an annual rite of Spring) and spent an hour on the porch in silence, watching Nature shift and people pass by. The crocus and daffodils finished, the leaves past the golden green, the flowering trees within a few days of being costumed in summer green.

Nature's first green is gold,
Her hardest hue to hold.
Her early leaf's a flower;
But only so an hour.
Then leaf subsides to leaf.
So Eden sank to grief,
So dawn goes down to day.
Nothing gold can stay.

LOCAL RECYCLING OPPORTUNITIES



- Bring pull tabs from cans to church.
 There is a container in the front entryway. The tabs are sent to Shriner's Hospital and are then sold to a recycling company. The Shriners use the money to help sick children.
- Bring 5 cent deposit bottles and cans to church to the back entryway.
 Volunteers return them and the money received goes to help OSRC's mission projects.
- 3. Bring metal objects to the American Legion on Clancy Street and place in their huge container in the parking lot. The metal gets sold to a recycling company. The legion uses the money to help Boy Scouts and veterans.
- 4. Bring clothes, shoes, belts, linens and stuffed animals to the Blue Boxes in the alley behind the church, to the parking lot at Byron's Market, or to Hearthstone Veterinary on Rt. 29. The items are sold to a recycling company. Items that are still good go to people who need them, at a low cost. The other items are recycled into new materials. This is a project of the Women's Guild, and they use the money to make quarterly donations to the church.
- 5. Plastic bottle tops can also be brought to the church, where a church member donates them to a mission project.

HYMNS OF OUR FAITH

"Sing to the Lord, you saints of his; praise his holy name." (Psalm 30:4)

"People Need the Lord"

"People need the Lord; people need the Lord; At the end of broken dreams, he's the open door."

"People need the Lord" is a short but very sing-able contemporary hymn, written by friends from the mid-west. Its inspiration comes from an example demonstrated by Jesus, and by an experience which its authors shared.

In Mark's Gospel, Chapter 6, we have the account of Jesus feeding the Five Thousand. Mark tells us that Jesus and his disciples were looking to get away from the crowds for a needed time of rest. But the adoring crowds pursued Jesus and found him. As Jesus stepped on to the shore "he saw a great crowd; and he began to teach them many things." (v. 34) The "people needed the Lord," and the Good Shepherd provided both physical and spiritual food.



The hymn's authors, Greg Nelson and Phill McHugh, "were eating lunch in a restaurant one day and both observed that the waitress seemed to be sad and lonely. When they returned to their car afterward, one of them said, "You know, people need the Lord." They proceeded to write the song that afternoon.

Most of us lead very busy lives. We need to earn a living, tend to our homes and look after the welfare of those most dear to us. But our Lord urges us to have a wider view; to look beyond self-preservation or advancement; to look beyond our closest loves to see a world that is in need; a world that needs the shepherd we have found in our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.
