HYMNS OF OUR FAITH

"Sing to the Lord, you saints of his; praise his holy name." Psalm 30:4

"Near the Cross"

"Jesus keep me near the cross, there's a precious fountain, Free to all a healing stream, flows from Calvary's mountain. In the cross, in the cross, be my glory ever, Till my raptured soul shall find rest beyond the river."

This is another hymn by the prolific American hymnwriter, Fanny Crosby. It's one hymn among the 8,000 hymn texts that she wrote. The poem was set to a tune by William H. Doane, her principal collaborator. The hymn is a devotional prayer, especially suited to the Lenten season, or for use in celebrating the Lord's Supper.

The second verse speaks to the time when one turns to God for salvation- "Near the cross...love and mercy found me." The third verse addresses the believer's journey of faith- ..."help me walk from day to day with its shadow over me." The last verse suggests the time of reunion with God – "I'll watch and wait...till I reach the golden strand." The refrain refers to Galatians 6: 14, (NKJV): "God forbid that I should glory (boast) in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ."

There are allusions to other Scripture texts, notably John 19: 25 (NRSV) – "Meanwhile, standing near the cross of Jesus were his mother, and his mother's sister, Mary, the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene," and Revelation 2: 1-2 (NRSV) – "Then the angel showed me the river of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb through the middle of the street of the city."

As God's people, we should live daily with a sensitive awareness of Christ's cross. We should review its scenes of suffering as well as revel in its triumph." (Pastor Jim Farris, Calvary Temple)
