#### Music in our Hearts and Church

Going to Church is a personal experience for each member of the congregation. What we hear, how we feel, and how we respond is different for everyone. In each case, our goal is to give the congregation something to think about while enjoying the beauty of the music itself.

You may have noticed that recently Dave Wever, Bruce Guerineau and I have offered music in a different form. Our goal is to support the ministry with a different kind of music that might speak to our congregation in a different form. We plan to prepare and present music throughout the year and hopefully in different styles, from guitar, to recorders, singing, and maybe even invite a special guest to share in the journey. We are confident that there is something for everyone, and we look forward to being a part of this journey with our congregation. You will next hear us share music on Palm Sunday. Dave will be singing a powerful piece called "Thief" by a Christian band called Third Day. This message will foreshadow the themes of Holy Week, leading to Easter. My message at the pulpit on Palm Sunday will emphasize the Triumphal Entry and the events leading to the Crucifixion of Jesus. We hope you will come join us, either in person or online. May music touch your hearts and strengthen your love of God and bless your experience at Old Saratoga Reformed Church.

#### **HYMNS OF OUR FAITH**

"Sing to the Lord, ye saints of his; praise his holy name." Psalm 30:4

"Hallelujah! What a Savior"

"Man of Sorrows" what a name for the Son of God who came, Ruined sinners to reclaim! Hallelujah! What a Savior.

Bearing shame and mocking rude, in my place condemned he stood, Sealed my pardon with his blood: Hallelujah; what a Savior."

The first verse of this hymn is based on Isaiah 53:3 "He is despised and rejected of men; a man of sorrows acquainted with grief: and we hid as it were our faces from him; he was despised and we esteemed him not."

The text of this hymn is appropriate to the Lenten Season, alluding to Jesus' arrest, trial and crucifixion, and looking to Christ's return for his saints. Christ's redemptive work is affirmed. The text and tune are the work of Phillip P. Bliss (1838-1876) whose early love of music came from songs his parents sang. Bliss taught school in Hartsville and in Rome, both in NYS. After receiving formal instruction in music, he became a music educator and a fine baritone singer. He added music composition to his many talents, and worked with Dwight L. Moody and Ira Sankey.

Some of his other well-known hymns are "Wonderful Words of Life", "I Will Sing of My Redeemer", and "It Is Well With My Soul."

"When he comes, our glorious King, all his ransomed home to bring, Then anew this song we'll sing; Hallelujah! What a Savior!"
