Pastor Susan Kerr's last name is pronounced Care, which the committee found fitting after meeting her. She is coming to us from Old North Reformed Church in Dumont New Jersey. CLASSIS MEETING AT OSRC

It was a happy and proud moment for OSRC when, at the May Schenectady Classis meeting held in our sanctuary, **Dick Behrens** was commissioned as a Preaching Elder. Dick had completed several classes in preaching during the last few years, was examined by the Classis following the completion, and therefore was confirmed as a preaching elder. He was formally commissioned on May 24. Many of his family and friends were present at the classis worship service to witness the happy moment. OSRC presented him with gifts of a Bible with his name and "Preaching Elder" engraved into the cover, and, on a lighter note, a navy blue t-shirt printed with the words "Help! I'm preaching and I can't shut up!" Congratulations, Dick!

HYMNS OF OUR FAITH

"Sing to the Lord, ye saints of his; praise his holy name." Psalm 30:4

"O For a Closer Walk With God"
"O for a closer walk with God, the calm of sins forgiven,
A light to shine upon the road that leads at last to
heaven."

The Old Testament scriptures tell us that Enoch, Noah and Abraham "walked with God." William Cowper, the great 18th century English poet, never equated himself with these patriarchs of old, but he certainly desired a stronger relationship with the Almighty - "a closer walk with God." His early life was full of personal anguish. The death of his mother when he was six years old, several school changes, and being "bullied" in his teen years resulted in great anxiety and depression. He was hospitalized at one point in his life for insanity. In his adult life he became a Latin scholar and completed law studies. But his strength was found in writing verse, hymns, and treatises attacking the practice of slavery.

The words of "O For a Closer Walk With God" seem to reflect Cowper's struggle with insecurity and doubt. The phrase in the first verse "...the calm of sins forgiven" seems to speak to his belief that his sins had brought darkness into his life. In verse three Cowper writes, "From every idol I have known now set my spirit free" which speaks to the overflowing weight of his struggle with depression. Verse five of the hymn appears to reflect the liberation that William Cowper found in a renewed relationship with his creator.

"So shall my walk be close with God, my wanderings be forgiven.

So shall his light mark out the road that leads at last to heaven."

PENTECOST



Beginning on Sunday, June 5, we will be in the season of Pentecost. On Pentecost Sunday, the Holy Spirit filled the church with power and added 3,000 new believers.

Pentecost was a Jewish festival/holiday, and by law all adult Jewish men would come to Jerusalem for a harvest festival. But we don't celebrate it the same way it was in the Old Testament. Pentecost for us is the moment in history after Christ ascended. He had promised during his earthly ministry that he would send the Comforter. And it was in at that moment that the Holy Spirit empowered the early believers, specifically the apostles that were left. That is when thousands came into the faith. And it went from this little sect of believers who followed a Jewish rabbi from Nazareth, who died and rose again. The apostles became more knowing, and had a greater understanding of the mysteries of the Gospel, and were more qualified to preach it to people of all nations and languages.

Pentecost has taken on a new significance for us. It at one point was just a historical memory. Now it is the living reality of the moment that the Spirit of God burst forth.
