### **Greetings Friends!**

God has truly been faithful and blessed us! I am delighted to announce that we have an (almost official) new minister! This past weekend, we welcomed Pastor Susan Kerr to Schuylerville with a Pot Luck Supper on Saturday evening. The food was delicious, and Susan moved from table to table at 15 minute intervals so everyone had a fair chance to speak with her. On Sunday, she led our worship service and then we held a congregational meeting. After a summary of the process that brought us to this point, people had a chance to ask questions and make comments. The vote was unanimous to recommend to Consistory that she be our next pastor. The Consistory then met, under the supervision of Pastor Janet Vincent, to vote to bring her to Old Saratoga Reformed Church. Then Consistory met with Susan to review her contract, which is now signed and on its way to Schenectady Classis for final approval. Susan is planning to move into the parsonage in mid-August and spend some time unpacking and settling in before beginning her duties the week after Labor Day. We look forward to having her as our pastor and beginning a new phase of ministry at OSRC.

It has been an honor to chair the Search Committee and work with its dedicated members to achieve our goal of finding someone who would be a good fit for us, at a time when there is a serious shortage of ministers. In the cover letter we sent with our Church Profile to the RCA Job Website we wrote: *We are looking for a minister who wants to become part of our church family and community. We are looking for a Pastor, not just a minister. One of the members of the local Ecumenical Clergy Group recently wrote about the difference between the two stating that, "To call someone pastor means you trust them with your spiritual growth and well-being. You call them that because you know they will care about you and help you become what God called you to be."* 

We believe Susan is the person who will be our pastor, not just our minister, and we thank God for guiding our process and bringing her to our attention. We ask your prayers that God will bless our ministry together, and we encourage you to participate in that ministry. **Chris Garney**

## HYMNS OF OUR FAITH

"Sing to the Lord, ye saints of his; praise his holy name." Psalm 30:4 "My Soul Has Found a Resting Place" "My soul has found a resting place, not in device or creed. I trust the ever living One. His wounds for me shall plead. I need no other evidence; I need no other plea.

It is enough that Jesus died, and that he died for me."

This hymn is a simple statement of faithsalvation in Christ's work or redemption on the cross and nothing else. Salvation is not dependent on our effort. It is not dependent on anything we can create, or touch, or on repeated recitations.

Our creeds do have importance and are not to be disregarded. Our creeds help to define truth, correct error, and provide rules and standards. But the hymn writer insists that salvation and eternal rest are simply found in our acceptance of what God has done for us through his Son.

Inspiration for this hymn may have come in part from Matt. 11:28 where Jesus invites us to find rest in him. Hebrews 4: 3 speaks of those who believe the "good news" entering into eternity.

The hymn writer was Eliza Hewitt, who was born in Philadelphia in 1851. She aspired to be a teacher, but a spinal malady prevented that. Her deep faith and a passion for writing poetry led to hymn writing and creating Sunday School materials for her church and a home for orphaned children. One can imagine that her life experiences inspired her faith and the lyrics for this hymn.

## Quarterly- Things of My Very Own

Things of My Very Own provides transitional services to children who have been removed from their homes, and works with the nonabusive parent or foster care provider to give the children what they need in a new home: bedding, clothing, hygiene products, emergency food, school and medical supplies. Many of the children have missed a lot of school, and services are supplied to give them experiences they may have missed by not being in attendance. There are also family crisis recovery services and life skills development programs for the children.

#### Monthly- Unity House

Unity House embraces the view that everyone deserves equal economic, political and social rights, and they work together to open doors of access and opportunity for everyone. They recently opened a satellite office in Hoosick Falls, giving greater access to people in rural areas dealing with domestic abuse.
