
## COMMUNITY CHRISTMAS CONCERT Sun. Dec. 4 at 3pm at Old Saratoga Reformed Church

## **Quarterly – The Giving Circle**

Giving Circle is an all-volunteer organization based in Saratoga. It was founded in 2005 with a mission to seek out communities and individuals in need and connect them with the resources to help. It was initially started in response to Hurricanes Katrina and Rita, where work was done rebuilding homes in southern Mississippi. It has since expanded efforts both locally and internationally, working with underserved families in the Capital District, Uganda and Ukraine

### **Monthly- Guardian House**

The Guardian House in Ballston Spa is a residence providing housing for homeless women veterans, and supports their reintegration into society, with mental health and substance counseling, job training and other services. Women comprise 14% of military personnel and face many of the same stress-related combat illnesses as men. With the advent of cold weather, it is expected that all the beds will be filled.
