MISSION GIVING

Old Saratoga Reformed Church supports many mission projects each year. At their annual meeting in the fall, the Deacons establish a mission plan which includes the monthly Deacons' Fund charities and the Missions of the Quarter. These missions are funded by specific donations that people make and are supplemented by funds from recycling bottles and cans.

Bottle and can money also allows us to support needs that we do not receive specific donations toward. So far this year, we have made donations to the RCA Disaster Relief fund to help with the aftermath of the earthquakes in Turkey and Syria, The Giving Circle to enhance the salary of a teacher at their school in Uganda, and Sleep in Heavenly Peace to help provide materials for building beds for local children who currently sleep on the floor.

Several years ago, the Deacons established the Deacons' Discretionary Fund which accepts donations and is also supplemented by bottle and can money. This fund is designed to help local community members who have an unexpected need. This year, we helped after a local fire and with travel expenses for medical treatment. If you know of someone who needs help, please let the Deacons or Pastor Susan know.

These donations are discreet and always very much appreciated. You can also contact a Deacon if you have an idea for an organization that we might want to support in the future.

Thank you to all of you who donate to our missions, give us your bottles and cans, and help to get the bottles and cans recycled. You are making a difference not just here at OSRC, but throughout our community and the world.



Old Saratoga Reformed Church Statement of Inclusion

Led by the love of Jesus Christ, we the people of OSRC in Schuylerville, faithfully declare that we are a Welcoming and Affirming congregation. We welcome into the full life of our congregation all persons whom God calls to us, and affirm their gifts to the glory of God.

Hymns of Our Faith

"Sing to the Lord, you saints of his; praise his holy name. (Psalm 30:4)

"And Can it Be That I Should Gain?"

"And can it be that I should gain an interest in the Savior's blood? Died he for me who caused his pain? For me who him to death pursued? Amazing love!

How can it be, that thou my God shouldst die for me?"

This hymn is about God's grace extended to humankind. It tells the story of the conversion of Charles Wesley (1707-1788), a prolific hymn writer who wrote over 6,500 hymns. Charles has been called by some, "the greatest hymnwriter of all ages." He was the younger brother of Methodist founder John Wesley, an Anglican cleric. The brothers traveled throughout Britain preaching and hymn-singing.

"And Can it Be..." was perhaps influenced by two Bible verses; Romans 5:8, "While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.," and Galatians 2:20, "I live by faith in the Son of God who loved me and gave himself for me." The hymn is rich with phrases from Holy Scripture and an allusion to the apostle Peter, where Wesley expresses his conversion story in terms of Peter's escape from prison "my chains fell off."

The story line of the hymn is summarized in the first line of each of the hymns five verses. Staring with a question as to the worthiness of the writer to be a recipient of God's favor. Verse two, proclaims the mystery of God's grace. Verse three, tells of Christ reaching out to us through his incarnation, Verse four, man's lowly condition, an "imprisoned spirit...fast bound in sin." Verse five, **no** fear of condemnation, we are alive in Christ.

"Tis mercy all, immense and free"

"Amazing love! How can it be that thou, my God, shouldst die for me?"




